# More listed criminals Mongla Port won't be behind bars

### STAFF CORRESPONDENT

A total of 62 people, including 14 listed criminals, were arrested by the joint forces in the 24 hours ending at 8:00am yesterday.

The joint forces of the army, the BDR and police recovered two revolvers, two shotguns, one Chinese rifle, one shutter gun and 168 bullets during the period.

The arrests pushed the number of people rounded up since the start of the anti-crime crackdown on October 17 to 10,617, including 2,329 listed criminals. The joint forces have so far seized 1,930 firearms and 29,239 rounds of ammunition

In Natore, three people were arrested by the joint forces in Shingra upazila Monday night.
