

New base in Iraq for UN inspectors as troops mass

UN arms inspectors yesterday set up a new base in northern Iraq to speed up the hunt for alleged banned weapons as more US and British troops prepared to join comrades already massed in the Gulf.

Iraqi Foreign Minister Najji Sabri accused the United States of trying to destabilise Iraq by supporting Iraqi exiles whom he described as "mercenaries and terrorists".

In a letter to UN Secretary General Kofi Annan, Sabri said a US plan to train exiled Iraqis to take part in a post-Saddam Hussein administration was an aggression that broke international laws.

"Bush's administration is supporting mercenaries and terrorists to destabilise the political situation and the social security in Iraq," said the letter, published in Baghdad's press.

Washington has threatened war if Iraq does not give up alleged chemical, biological and nuclear weapons. But Saddam denies having such armory and says the

UN inspections will expose American claims as lies.

Addressing thousands of cheering soldiers in his home state of Texas on Friday, President Bush said a war against Iraq would be one of liberation, not conquest.

"Should Saddam seal his fate by refusing to disarm, by ignoring the opinion of the world, you'll be fighting not to conquer anybody but to liberate people," he told the troops.

Defence officials said the Pentagon had ordered some units of the U.S. 1st Marine Expeditionary Force to go to the Gulf.

The troops, together with more than 11,000 infantry soldiers based in Georgia, and specialists based in Germany will join nearly 60,000 U.S. military personnel already in the region.

Washington's staunchest ally Britain will send more than 20,000 troops and mobilise 7,000 reservists next week, the Daily Telegraph newspaper said yesterday.

With the drums of war beating louder, a team of UN weapons inspectors travelled to the city of Mosul, 220 miles north of Baghdad

to set up a permanent regional office from where they would launch inspections in northern Iraq.

"This will help us expand and accelerate our inspections throughout the country, but particularly in the north," UN inspectors' spokesman Hiro Ueki told reporters before leaving to Mosul with the team.

The inspectors must report their findings to the Security Council by January 27. Chief weapons inspector Hans Blix will make an interim report to the UN Security Council on Thursday.

The council passed a resolution in November demanding Iraq give a full account of its weapons programs and cooperate with weapons inspectors, as required by resolutions stemming from the 1991 Gulf War, or face tough consequences.

Teams from the UN Monitoring, Inspection and Verification Commission (UNMOVIC) and International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) visited at least five sites yesterday, including a brewery that produces the spirit arak.

Inspections are now in their sixth week but the experts have yet to

disclose any evidence of banned weapons programs.

Turkish Prime Minister Abdullah Gul flew to Syria yesterday at the start of a tour of Middle East countries looking for ways to head off a war in neighbouring Iraq that he likened to a "Pandora's box."

NATO member Turkey is expected to offer airspace and logistical support for the United States. However Ankara has been dragging its feet over making a firm commitment, hoping to avoid war and the political and economic turmoil it may bring.

"Iraq is like a Pandora's box... This box should not be opened. Iraq should not be scattered because it would not be possible to put everyone back in again," Gul said in an interview with Aksam newspaper before he left for Syria, Egypt and Jordan.

Gul said the chief responsibility for avoiding a war lay with Saddam. But Baghdad says it has done all it can to accommodate inspectors who it says have found nothing incriminating after visiting at least 230 sites.

2 killed, 10 hurt in N'ganj bus mishap

Two persons were killed and ten others injured in a road accident on the Dhaka-Chittagong Highway under Bandar apazila yesterday morning.

Police and witnesses said the accident occurred at around 8-30 am when a Dhaka bound bus from Narayanganj fell into a roadside ditch in Keodhala area as the driver lost control over the vehicle.

One of the dead was identified as Momtaz, 40.

The injured bus passengers were admitted to different hospitals and clinics in Dhaka and Narayanganj.

The driver of the bus fled the scene.

report on the December 8 serial blasts in four Mymensingh cinemas.

Home Minister Altaf Hossain Chowdhury was quoted as saying that the attack might have been a work of al-Qaeda terrorists. Next day, however, the home minister denied having talked to any journalist.

Later it turned out that Enam, who filed the report, mistook another person, a journalist, for the minister and used his comment.

On December 13, the government arrested Enam under Section 54 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC).

He was later shown arrested in connection with the Mymensingh blasts and detained under the Special Powers Act (SPA).

While moving the petition for Enam, Dr Kamal Hossain observed that the way Enamul had been detained violated human rights.

Enam was not allowed to meet anyone for 16 days. He was later allowed to meet people in presence of the police.

While on remand, he was allegedly tortured both mentally and physically.

Purbachal plots: List of NRBs announced

Rajuk yesterday announced a list of 2961 expatriate Bangladeshis who have been selected for plots in the Purbachal New Town Project, said a press release.

A list of selected allottees in other categories will also be announced shortly.

The allottees have been requested to deposit bank draft or pay order by March 31 in favour of the Rajuk chairman on the basis of the rate fixed by Rajuk. The amount will be adjusted with the total price of a plot.

The rate is \$3000 for a three-katha plot, \$6000 for five-katha, \$11,000 for 7.5-katha and \$15,000 for a 10-katha plot, the press release said.

The bank draft or pay order should be sent directly to the Sonali Bank, Janata Bank or Agrani Bank Rajuk Bhaban branch, Dhaka.

If the allottees fail to make the payment within the specified time, Rajuk may review its decision regarding the allotted plots, the press release added.

Two arrested for selling fake FF certificates

Plainclothes police arrested two people from Devidwar and Brahmanpara early Friday on charge of supplying fake Muktioddha certificates.

The arrested were identified as Abdul Mannan in Devidwar and Kamaluddin in Brahmanpara.

It is alleged that the two were part of a 6-member organised gang engaged in supplying forged Muktioddha certificates among applicants for the post of police constable in exchange for huge amount of money.

Police arrested 16 job seekers on Thursday as they came to the district police line to join the police service with fake certificates of wards of freedom fighters.

Sixteen people along with the two other arrested were produced before a local court Friday.

Police sources said they nabbed the 16 job seekers as they, out of 20, were finally selected for the post of constable under the quota for sons of freedom fighters.

Police officials became suspicious when the 16 men finally selected for police constables submitted the certificates to the officials, who later sent the certificates to the ministry concerned for verification.

The ministry after checking found all the certificates to be fake.

After the confessional statement of the 16 people, police unearthed the organised gang that used to make the fake certificates and supply them among job seekers.

A case was filed with police.

said Sarkar at a 'Meet the Press' at the Kolkata Press Club yesterday.

However, Sarkar did not blame Dhaka for the 'anti-Indian bases conducting their operations in Bangladesh'. "They have their own problems to look after. The impetus should be from our side to try and find out a solution. But strangely that National Democratic government at the Centre plays a silent role," he said.

When journalists asked him about the involvement of the CIA, Sarkar replied, "It was they who gave birth to the ISI. So, they should also be held responsible for all the activities that the ISI carries on today."

The Tripura chief minister added that intelligence departments of his government had a detailed report as to where the 51 bases were in Bangladesh and the total amount of firepower and manpower they had. "We have given the entire report to the Central Government in Delhi. And our reports have matched the facts that they had gathered."

Citing the growing dangers of terrorism as the main obstacle to Tripura's development, Sarkar said he had also asked the Central Government to take certain preventive measures.

"But they have not done so," he said. "I had asked for fencing off the entire 156 kilometres that separate Tripura from Bangladesh. Along with that I had also asked the Central Government in Delhi to start discussions with the Bangladesh government regarding the dismantling of these camps in a joint operation. But they have not done so."

"... Unless a joint effort is made by the Bangladesh and the Indian governments in tackling the ultras, development in Tripura will not take place. Mind you I am always talking about a joint operation."

When asked whether his government was willing to start discussions with the Bangladesh government on this issue, he pointed out, "This is an international matter. We can be a part of the discussion if the Indian government wants us. But we cannot start it."

The Tripura chief minister stated that he was optimistic about an immediate launch of the bus service between Agartala and Dhaka. "I am sure it will start by the middle of this year."

Asked what he thinks about use of roads in Bangladesh for a transit to Tripura, Sarkar said, "We surely want that. Tripura is hemmed in by Bangladesh on three sides. But then you cannot only think of us.

Bangladesh also has certain opinions regarding transit. Their opinions and proposals will also have to be considered.

"But if transit does take place it will really be beneficial to us. We just cannot demand the rights for transit. We have to consider the merits and demerits. And above all, we have to see to it that the interest of Bangladesh is never hampered."

He was also admitted that Awami League leaders like Joyal Hazari and Shamim Osman had taken refuge in Tripura immediately after the change of government in Dhaka.

"They were in Tripura for sometime last year. But at present we have no idea about their whereabouts," he concluded.

Second cloned baby due today

The world's second cloned baby is due to be born today by natural childbirth to a Dutch woman, the head of the Raelian sect in the Netherlands said yesterday.

"She will have a normal birth. It is due tomorrow, but maybe it will be a bit early or bit late," Bart Overvliet, Dutch chairman of the movement, told Reuters.

The child, a girl, was created by Clonaid, the same cloning firm that claimed last month to have organised the birth of the first human clone to a 31-year-old US woman.

Like the contenders and campaigners, election officials are also spending restless hours to manage the election to the grassroots-level local government bodies.

Scrutiny of nomination papers, distribution of election symbols, purchase of polls materials, issuance of official orders, holding of meetings to ensure security and other related work have made their task hectic.

The Election Commission is scheduled to allocate election symbols to candidates on January 10. It may arrange lottery if more than one candidate seek the same election symbol in the same Union Parishad.

After finalising the lists of candidates, the commission will go for the huge task of publishing ballot papers.

Meanwhile, the EC validated a total of 20,4378 out of 212239 nomination papers submitted for the posts of chairman, member and female member.

Due to errors in filing, the EC found invalid 848 nomination papers for posts of chairman, 5,061 for member and 1,952 for seats reserved for women.

According to EC, 24,089 nomination papers were filed for posts of chairman, 1,46,617 for member and 41,533 for the reserved seats.

The aspirants can appeal to Returning Officers till today against rejection of their nomination papers. The last date for withdrawal of candidature is January 9.
