"Pasang is our libero and he is an exciting player at the back. And Dorji is also a good attacking player who can score from difficult chances," he



The International Cricket Council (ICC) has said that dope-testing is mandatory for all the participating teams in the World Cup because of South African government regulations.

It is the first time that dope tests will be conducted in the game's biggest event. Only four cricket nations -- Australia, South Africa, New Zealand and England -- have a doping policy in place.


