Shane did not kiss

An Australian businessman tried to blackmail the Australian Cricket Board by claiming bowler Shane Warne stole a kiss from his 16-yearold niece in a public street, a court heard Wednesday. Christopher Kent in Queensland state in eastern Australia, appeared in the Melbourne Magistrates' Court charged with trying to blackmail the board for 5,000 dollars (2,850 US) and for using a telephone to cause menace. In January last year, the girl and several friends reportedly pursued Australian cricketers Warne Australia's premier spin bowler, and pace bowler Brett Lee in a car on the Gold Coast tourist strip until the pair pulled over in their sports car. The court heard Kent told the ACB Warne subsequently kissed the girl and he demanded money to keep silent about the incident. Police said there was no evidence to support the allegation against Warne, who has described it as an attempt to cash in on his fame. Defence lawyer Jason Murakami said Kent maintained his innocence and would vigorously defend the charges. The case is due back in court


