Australia's star fast bowler Glenn McGrath was confident he would be fit to play against England in a triangular series one-day cricket clash here Saturday.

McGrath, who has been out with a side strain, said Friday it had been tough watching from the sidelines as Australia lost the fifth Test to England and were then crushed by Sri Lanka on Thursday.

"I just can't wait to get back out there," he said.

McGrath said he was "90 per cent-plus fit and feeling pretty good." But management were to wait until they saw how he pulled up following another testing workout before deciding whether he will play.
