Fighting Bosnich

Chelsea's Australian international goalkeeper Mark Bosnich will fight a Football Association misconduct charge which could end his career following a positive drugstestforcocaine.

Bosnich was suspended from all football-related activities after being found quilty of breaching doping regulations and bringing the game into disrepute.

He was given 14 days in which to respond to the FA charge and his legal team replied on Friday afternoon, shortly before the deadline was due to expire.

His lawyers made it clear that the 30-year-old would be requesting a personal hearing and would be seeking to answer the charge against him.

FA spokesman Adrian Bevington said: "I can confirm that Mark Bosnich's legal team have responded and they are contesting the charge.

If Bosnich is found guilty of the FA charge at the as yet unscheduled hearing, he could receive a lengthy ban from the game.

However, he maintains his innocence even though the onus is now on him to prove why traces of the drug were apparently found in his system in a random test.

The former Aston Villa and Manchester United keeper was charged by the FA after confirmation that his 'B' sample had tested positive for cocaine, just as his initial 'A' sample had done back in November.

Chelsea, who had suspended him without pay, notified him in writing earlier this week that his contract would be terminated 14


been earning around 40,000 pounds (64,000 dollars) a week at Stamford Bridge, has been told by lawyers that he could be entitled to

"I think we deserved it, especially coming off a bad defeat. We had to react - and we did very well.

New Brazil coach Carlos Alberto Parreira is to keep faith with the bulk of the team which lifted a fifth World Cup in Japan last June, according to his technical co-ordinator Mario Zagallo.

"There is no doubt we will keep faith with the basis of the squad. The best thing in the world is to be able to utilise players from one Cup to the next - all the more so when those players are world champions," Zagallo told Friday's O Globo daily.

But according to Zagello, coach of the 1970 World Cup winning side, Parreira will change the team's style, particularly in defence where he is set to drop predecessor Luiz Felipe Scolari's three-man back line.

"The team will be similar to that which operated in my time as coach,' explained Zagallo. "Starting off with the tactical side of the game - with four defenders and four in midfield, which is the favourite system of Parreira and myself."

Zagello believes that four players -Ronaldo, Ronaldinho, Rivaldo and Roberto Carlos - will continue to form the nucleus of the team.

"But many things can happen before the 2006 World Cup," said Zagallo, who orchestrated Brazil's 1994 success in tandem with Parreira and who additionally was twice world champion as a player.

Zagallo insisted he was not pulling the strings, merely stating Parreira's preferences

"I am not the coach, Parreira is. It is he who will decide and have the last word. If necessary, I will be a kind of


