Morshed leaves today for the US, and says, "I am going there under the prime minister's instruction to understand the situation and follows to include a nation in the list. will not request him to drop


Bangladesh from the list, as it is a unilateral decision of the US."

The government has unilaterally decided to form 41 parliamentary standing committees in the upcoming winter session of the Jatiya

It has already drafted lists for the committees and Prime Minister Khaleda Zia has so far approved chairmen and members of 37 of them, according to highly placed

The rest would be finalised within a couple of days, they said.

The committees are being formed more than a year after the eighth parliament came into being.

The sources said the government has decided to follow the previous regime, and thus no post of chairman of any committee would be given to the main opposition



Five slaughtered SHAZNEEN CASE at Joypurhat Cross-examination mazaar

Armed miscreants slaughtered five people inside a mazar (Shrine) at Begungram village under Kalai upazila in the district Monday night.

Police said a gang of unidentified miscreants entered the mazar at midnight and slaughtered its khadem (caretaker) Noor Uddin, 60, and cooks Dulal Hossain, 35, Motiur Rahman, 28, Shafir Uddin, 70 and Afaz

The criminals broke open the locker of the mazar and looted Tk 50,000 and other valuables. They also took away 14 ceiling fans from the mazar. On information, Kalai police reached the spot yesterday morning and

sent the bodies to Joypurhat Sadar Hospital morgue for autopsy. Deputy Commissioner Mohsin Ali Sardar (Bir Pratik) and Superintendent Police Habibur Rahman visited the spot.

As the news of the gruesome killings inside the mazar spread, hundreds of villagers gathered on its premises. Additional police force was deployed in and around the mazar.

The mazar was built over the grave of Khwaja Abdul Gafur Chishti of Pir Kasimpur village, Muradnagar, Comilla. Khwaja Chishti died in 1974 at Begungram village in Joypurhat.

N'ganj, Magura polls debacle

BNP blames it on bad choice, infighting

The ruling Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) has put its Narayanganj and Magura municipal elections debacle down to wrong choice of candidates and intra-party squab-

leadership and cabinet ministers for completely ignoring organisational

Senior BNP leaders said that the top ranking leaders of the party did not give any attention to the municipal polls, and they were not attachng due importance to the upcoming Union Parishad elections either.

the responsibility of selecting candidates, that the ruling party would back, miserably failed to choose popular ones, and they nominated their 'own men'," observed a senior

The leaders observed that the three-month long army drive also seriously affected the organisational activities of the party. Most of the active workers of the party at the grass- roots level were either harassed or arrested during the drive. A large number of field-level activists, who went on hiding, have not yet returned to their respective

Moreover, the price hike of essential commodities, particularly rice, potato, edible oil, onion and sugar, and the decision to increase the price of patrol have been a negative factor for the ruling party.

Criticising their own government, they said that instead of creating new employment opportunities, the government had started massive retrenchment from different sectors, which has been an unpopular move.

Indiscriminate arrests of opposition leaders and filing of cases against political opponents also affected the results of the polls.

An influential leader of the BNP said although the municipal polls were non-political, the defeats in Narayanganj and Magura embarrassed the party. " But that does not mean that the voters have shifted to the Awami League camp. The SEE PAGE 11 COL 4

Hearing on charge framing January 26

The Speedy Trial Tribunal, Dhaka Division, yesterday fixed January 26 for hearing on charge-framing against the accused in the Sabegun Nahar Sonv murder case

Judge Shahed Noor Uddin issued the order after the case was placed before him.

The Detective Branch (DB) of police submitted a charge sheet to the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's (CMM's) Court, Dhaka, on January 4 against Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) cadre Mokammel Hayat Khan Muki and 14 others.

The 14 others are Musfiq Uddin Tagar, Mockbul Hossain Mukul, Sirajul Islam alias Wasim, Zakir Hossain Patwari alias Munna, Nurul Islam Sagar alias Tepa Nurul Islam, S M Masum Billah, Sheikh Solaiman alias Babul, Dulal, Rafiq alias Rafiq Chacha, Mohammad Masum, Sujan, Ayub, Year Mohammad and Mohiuddin
