#### UNB, Jhenidah


Highwaymen swooped on a truck and looted two lakh taka from cow traders on Jhenidah-Chuadanga road at Borai here early Sunday.

# Smugglers active in northern region

Smugglers have become active again in the country's northern region, including Sirajganj district ahead of holy Eid-ul-Azha.

Various Indian goods, including saree, sugar, cosmetics and drugs. are sent to different parts of the country. The goods are brought through different borders of the region in connivance with a section of police officials.

This year 1,98,704 candidates are contesting in 4,288 UPs. However, elections are being held in 4,222 unions due to last minute postponement of polls in 66 unions.
