Series of blasts No illegal Bangladeshi in Dinajpur: India, FM says in Delhi

Foreign Minister M Morshed Khan does not think India has any illegal migrant from Bangladesh but said immigration needs to be "more

"I don't think there is any illegal migrant from Bangladesh coming to India to live," Khan told reporters after an interactive session with the business community organised by the Confederation of Indian Industry

Khan now on a visit to India is due to call on Indian Prime Minister Atal Behari Vajpayee and Deputy Prime Minister LK Advani today.

About India's concern over illegal immigration from Bangladesh, he said both countries should deal with the issue according to internationally established rules and standards. "No side can be illogical or unreasonable."

Khan hoped the irritants in the way of improving bilateral ties would be sorted out during his talks with his Indian counterpart Yashwant Sinha. He was scheduled to meet Yashwant Sinha last night.

"I regard him (Sinha) as a brother and friend." Khan said. He assured the business community that they have "nothing to worry" about security. Bangladesh gears up to fight

Pointing to the potential for trade and economic cooperation between India and Bangladesh, Khan said, "If we have interests in each other and things are left to the business sector, a solid foundation will be built."

8 drown in Meghna, three still missing

Ariver cruise turned into a tragedy when eight people drowned and three went missing as their small launch, caught in a storm, sank in the Meghna river near Char Amirabad in Matlab Thursday

Twenty-nine wealthy people, believed to be relatives, left Pagla Ghat in the city on board MV Amit and went up to Ichali Ghat in Chandpur. As they started their return journey in the evening, the nature took its toll in the river at a

Poll violence in 4 dists kills 7, injures 200

At least seven people, including a minor girl, were killed and more than 200 injured in Union Parishad poll-related violence in Madaripur, Faridpur, Munshiganj and Bogra districts during the Eid holidays.

In a pre-election incident of violence on Wednesday, two people were killed and over 100 injured during clashes between two groups of supporters of rival chairman candidates in Khalia union of Rajoir Upazila in Madaripur.

The voting is scheduled for today (Saturday).

10 murdered during Eid holiday, 4 in city

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia called on President lajuddin Ahmed at the Bangabhaban Wednesday evening to offer Eid

At least 10 people were murdered in the country, four of them in the city, in the last four days since Tuesday

The victims include a policeman, killed in Shailkupa in Jhenidah.

In the city, Mohammad Ali, 40, accused in at least six criminal cases, was chopped and shot by a gang of 15 in front of Sahidnagar Macca Hotel in Lalbagh at about 2:30 pm on Tuesday. He died at Dhaka Medical College Hospital at about 4:30 pm.

Police said the victim was a gang leader of criminals and released on bail nine days ago. He might have been by his his rivals, they said.

The victim's sister Rasheda Begum filed a case with Lalbagh

man finished the first over carnage grabbing his fourth scalp with the fifth ball. He joined Pakistan off-spinner


