#### Rooney in record books

Wayne Rooney became the youngest ever England international here on Wednesday after coming on in England's 3-1 defeat by Australia at Upton Park at the age of 17 years and 111 days.

The prodigious Everton striker's extraordinary rise from obscurity to the international stage was completed when he ran out as a second half substitute among coach Sven-Goran Eriksson's 11 second half substitutions.

His first touch showed the confidence of a player more highly regarded than any other English youngster for a generation. He laid the ball off with his chest for Newcastle's Jermaine Jenas and picked up the return pass. A neat step over was followed by a cross that Aston Villa striker Darius Vassell nearly converted.

In the 69th minute Rooney swivelled and shot from outside the penalty area but he fell as he shot and the chance came to nothing. In stoppage time he tangled with Australia defender Lucas Neill after brilliantly keeping the ball in play from another Jenas pass, but he was adjudged to have fouled Neill. Rooney gave a competent debut

and succeeded in unnerving the Australia defence where his senior counterparts had failed dismally in His appearance broke a record that James Prinsep had held for 124

years. Prinsep was 17 years and 253 days when he played for England against Scotland at the Oval in 1879. Rooney also eclipsed the most recent teenage prodigy to make a

mark for England. Michael Owen was first capped 59 days after his 18th birthday and was still only 18 when he scored one of the World Cup's greatest ever goals against Argentina in 1998. Rooney has not even made an appearance for the England under-

based ones. France fielded a near fullstrength team but failed their sternest examination since their disastrous World Cup campaign, losing 2-0 at the Stade de France.

Goals from Zdenek Gryera and Liverpool striker Milan Baros handed Jacques Santini his first defeat since taking over last year. "The majority of the players were

just not up to what we can normally expect from them," said Santini. Lazio striker Bernardo Corradi scored on his debut to give Italy a 1-

0 win over Euro 2004 hosts Portugal in Genoa. One of three new caps, Corradi pounced from close range in the 62nd minute after Portugal goalkeeper Ricardo had failed to hold

Fabrizio Miccoli's stinging shot. The match was Luis Felipe Scolari's first in charge of Portugal after guiding Brazil to victory in last year's World Cup.

In Brazil's first match under new coach Carlos Alberto Parreira, superstar striker Ronaldo limped off injured and his teammates laboured to a 0-0 draw against China.

Holland beat Argentina with an 87th minute thunderbolt from Arsenal midfielder Giovanni van Bronckhorst in Amsterdam.

The match appeared to be heading for a goalless draw when van Bronckhorst hit a powerful 20yard shot which gave Argentinian goalkeeper Pablo Cavallero no chance.

Raul claimed the all-time Spanish goalscorer's record when

he collected a high ball from Ruben Baraja and fired a low shot past

Oliver Kahn after 31 minutes. Fredi Bobic pulled Germany level but 25-year-old Raul raised his tally to 31 goals in 59 games by

converting a penalty after he had been fouled in the box.

A goal from Guti completed the

job for Spain. Brian Kerr had a victorious debut in charge of Ireland as his side beat Berti Vogts' Scotland 2-0 at Hampden Park with early goals from Kevin Kilbane and Clinton

Wales twice came from behind to force a 2-2 draw with Bosnia-Herzegovina which extend their unbeaten run to a new national record of nine matches.

John Hartson notched the 74th minute equaliser after Elvir Baljic and Sergej Barbarez had put the visitors ahead at the Millennium

Robert Earnshaw had first equalised for Wales.

"I accept that we didn't play particularly well but I was obviously pleased with the result," said Welsh boss Mark Hughes.

World Cup semi-finalists Turkey were held to a goalless draw by Ukraine in Izmir.

But it was a good night for north African football as Morocco beat an under-strength Senegal 1-0 in Paris, giving new Senegal coach Guy Stephan a bad start, and Tunisia shocked Sweden 1-0 in Tunis in former France boss Roger Lemerre's second game in charge.


