The budget announced a sharp reduction in excise and customs duty on raw materials and machinery for the textile sector to face global competition under the WTO

Customs duty on a number of textile machinery has been reduced from 25 per cent to five per cent to encourage modernisation.

Excise duty on garments, woven fabrics and knitted fabrics has been reduced to 10 per cent from last

Peak customs duty has been slashed from 30 to 25 per cent; excise duty on car manufacture and air-conditioners has also been

reduced. This is the first budget presented by Jaswant Singh who was made finance minister in a cabinet reshuffle in July last year. Singh swapped portfolio with Yashwant Sinha who is now the foreign minister.



UNB, Dhaka

Foreign Minister Morshed Khan yesterday said his recent talks with Indian External Affairs Minister Yashwant Sinha substantially reduced tensions along the border over India's attempts to push Bengalispeaking Muslims into Bangladesh.

"The single-biggest achievement of my visit to India is that both the countries have recognised that any conflict could be solved at the table. not on frontiers... And I am glad that the real threat of a conflict has gone,' he told reporters at the Foreign Ministry yesterday afternoon.

The foreign minister visited India and held talks with his Indian counterpartSinhaonFebruary14inDelhi.

Khan said a foreign secretary-level meeting would be held in Dhaka next month when all bilateral issues would be discussed to find out solutions. "We may not resolve all issues overnight, but what we want is constant interactions and engagements to that effect," he said.

About the recent exchange of fire between BSF and BDR, the foreign minister said the issue is nothing new and has been going on for the last 30

On the European Parliamentary delegation's statement on certain crucial issues with Bangladesh, Morshed Khan declined to make any comment since "he was not in the country at that time" but said the team came here on a fact-finding
