Split to send Saddam wrong signal: Britain

Britain said yesterday splits that have delayed a fresh UN vote on Iraq were sending Saddam Hussein the wrong signal as opponents of a rush to war pressed for an extension of weapons inspections.

Efforts by Britain and the United States to give Iraq a March 17 ultimatum on scrapping weapons of mass destruction or face attack have failed to draw widespread backing, forcing them to put off a vote in the Security Council until later this week.



A 15-member army team of explosives experts, headed by Major Amirul Islam, defused Monday seven grenades on a school ground at Jhikargacha upazilla.

The grenades had been recov ered from two young men, Zahidul Islam Shumon and Shahidullah, while they were bound for Khulna from Benapole border along with four others by three motor cycles. The four accomplices managed to escape.

According to army experts, the grenades were very powerful. Each granade had an electric circuit, four pencil batteries and an electric switch, explosives experts said.

Arrestees Shumon and Shahidullah were placed on five days' police remand yesterday.

Police and officials of intelligence agencies believe that the arrestees belong to a well organ-ised gang of saboteurs having a countrywide network. They are being interrogated by the police and intelligence personnel. But till yesterday afternoon nothing significant came out of the intense interrogation, said the SP of sore, Shahidul Islam

Shumon told the interrogators that he and his accomplices took delivery of the arms, ammunitions, grenades and a huge quantity of explosive substances from one Faisal from Koikhali border in Satkhira district.

They were bound for Khulna via Benapole. We were assigned by Faisal to hand over the arms and grenades to extremist Faruque of Moilapota crossing under Khulna thana, Shumon said. He said the arms, grenades and all other things were brought from India. "We have our godfathers in Jessore and Khulna and we are dedicated to 'Jihad,' said Shumon but he refused to name his godfathers and the underground militant organisation he belonged to.

Shumon further said to the interrogators that he happened to meet Faruque in Dhaka two months ago. "Later, I went to Khulna from Jamalpur and met Faruque in a mosque at Moilapota where the whole plan was made to collect Indian arms and explosives from Jessore and Satkhira borders а
