SUST stalemate deepens

The stalemate at Shahjalal University of Science and Technology (SUST) in Sylhet has deepenednow.

The liaison committee of teachers, officers and employees, at a press conference on Saturday, has reiterated demand for immediate resignation of vice chancellor (VC) of the university, while another group of teachers termed the demand as unacceptable and

contradictory. The liaison committee went on a non-cooperation movement against the VC, while students under the banner of Common Students Forum were pressing for immediate resumption of academic activities. Students organised a rally protesting the teachers' movement. A group of teachers at a meeting

with Dr Habibul Ahsan, a syndicate member in the chair termed the agitation as 'unacceptable' saying most of the 10-point demands were already been met, while rest demands will be discussed at a

Liaison committee wants VC's exit Syndicate meeting scheduled to be held on March 23. They called for

withdrawal of the agitation programme till the Syndicate meet-

The agitating group lodged general diaries (GD) with Sylhet Kotwali Police Station against proctor Dr Golam Ali Haider howdhury and Assistant Proctor Murshed Chwodhury on charge of provocating students against teachers at their rally.

Convenor of liaison committee Dr Akhtarul Islam read out a written statement in the press conference. It was addressed, among others, by employees' union president Abdul Hai, teachers' association general secretary(GS) Hasanuzzaman Shyamol and ex-GS Dr Kabir Hossain, officers' association GS Khairul Akhtar Chwodhury. All of them alleged that the crisis was only due to inefficiency of the VC.

Students will hold a rally on Sunday which will be followed by a procession on the campus. Earlier, Shahjalal University of

Science and Technology Teachers'

Association (SUSTTA) announced a programme of 48-hour ultimatum Afterwards, they went on an indefi-nite strike on March 9 to press for VC's resignation. They were agitating for promotion, regularisation and other service related demands

of teachers and others. Later, officers and employees of the university extended their support to the demands of teachers. They also wanted fulfillment of their demands.

An influential quarter inside the university was reportedly behind the crisis.

Professor Mohammad Shafiqur Rahman, VC of the university told The Daily Star that most of the demands were already been met. He went on saying that a certain quarter was actively trying to create an unstable situation on the cam-pus. "I shall not accept any undue demand," he said. "A number of important issues will be discussed in the Syndicate meeting on March 20 " he further seid. "Lorenz merch " he further said. "I hope many problems will be solved there", he added.

Six policemen killed in 35 days in southwestern region

Six policemen were killed and 13 others critically injured by miscreants in southwestern (SW) region in 35 days this year, according to press reports and police sources.

Police in the region are now discharging their duties amid panic and insecurity due to killing of six of their colleagues from February 5 till March 11 this year.

Murder of two constables Ramesh and Shariful recently heightened the tension. They were killed in a bomb attack by unidenti-fied assailants near Sheikhpara branch of Janata Bank (JB) in Sonadanga thana of Khulna dis-

trict. Those killed by miscreants during the period are: Constables A K Fazlul Huq and Abdul Motalib. They were stabbed to death near Itagachcha police outpost in

Traffic sergeant Ariful Islam of Khulna Metropolitan Police (KMP) was critically injured and died while on way to hospital. He was injured as powerful bombs blasted outside the international trade fair at Khulna Circuit House ground on

Thirteen other policemen Ahad

Constable Shaheb Ali of Khulna Metropolitan Police (KMP) was killed on February 27. He came under attack when he and a subinspector went to Khalishpur to nab a criminal. March 1.

Ali, Abdul Karim, Álamgir Hossain, Mofizur Rahman, Naziur Huq, Shahidul, Serajul Huq, Harun-ar-Rashid, Monwarul Alam, Rahman, Paritosh, Moniruzzaman and Nizamuddin were critically injured by miscreants during the period. They are now fighting for life
