The contrasting race to the championship line could hardly be starker in Italy's Serie A and the German Bundesliga this season with Inter Milan hanging onto Juventus' coat-tails - whereas Bayern Munich have virtually wrapped up the title with almost three months to spare.

#### *SerieA*

Inter Milan kept the heat on Juve on Sunday, thrashing strugglers Como 4-0 at the San Siro to trim the deficit to three points after the 'Old Lady' had sent Modena packing 3-0 on Saturday with a double from Czech playmaker Pavel Nedved and a clincher from predatory Frenchman David Trezeguet.

Veteran Argentine Gabriel Batistuta bagged Inter's opener and Luigi Di Biagio added a second before Christian Vieri put the controversy of his midweek tussle with Newcastle striker Lomana Lua Lua behind him, heading home in the 57th and 76th minutes.

The burly forward should have had a hattrick but missed a penalty to leave his total for the campaign

Former Juve man Nicola Amoruso had earlier missed a spotkick for Como.

Juve have 57 points from their 25 matches to 54 for Inter while AC Milan lost ground after they could only manage a goalless draw Saturday at bottom five outfit Reggina, leaving the 'rossoneri' on

Elsewhere, Parma are back in the hunt for a top three finish after swamping fifth-placed Chievo 4-0 away to go to within two points of their rivals.

Real Madrid need to beat Lokomotiv Moscow in the Russian capital on Tuesday to be absolutely sure of keeping alive their bid for a fourth European crown in six

Vicente Del Bosque's reigning continental champions must have thought their passage to the quar-ter-finals of the Champions League would be simpler than this when they were paired with AC Milan, Borussia Dortmund and Lokomotiv in the second-phase Group C.

But Zidane, Raul, Ronaldo and co have struggled by their sky-high standards, losing away to Milan, drawing 2-2 with the Russians at their normally impregnable Bernabeu fortress and being held by the Germans in Dortmund.

Milan have already won the group after winning their opening four matches, while Real are sec-ond on eight points with Dortmund lurking just one point behind going into the final round of matches.

Iuve's influential captain Alessandro Del Piero came through a practice match on Saturday to test the recovery of an injury to his left thigh and he is expected to make the trip with the Italian league leaders, who beat Modena 3-0 on Saturday.

Manchester United, meanwhile, can expect a tough tie in Spain despite Deportivo's elimina-tion last week, although the Spanish league's leading scorer with 20 goals, Dutchman Roy Makaay, is likely to be rested.
