6 Oscars: That's 'Chicago'

THE clouds of wars, past and present, that hung over the 75th Anniversary Academy Awards on Sunday night threatened to overshadow some of the razzle-dazzle sparkle of "Chicago." The Miramax Films musical, which kicked off the evening with a couple of high-stepping awards, seemed to lose its footing towards the end of the emotional 3 1/2 hour ceremony at Hollywood's Kodak Theatre. It recovered with one final burst of energy as it won the Oscar for best picture.

Though "Chicago" was the night's big winner, earning six trophies including a best supporting actress nod for Catherine Zeta-Jones, it faced formidable competition from "The Pianist," Roman Polanski's harrowing account of one man's survival during World War II.

Not only was Polanski named

tell you that was in the gift bag," he cracked -- the lanky Brody marveled, "There comes a time in life when everything seems to make sense -- and this is not one of those times." Nevertheless he managed to thank his parents, acknowledge Wladyslaw Szpilman, the man he played onscreen, and to laud Polanski before expressing heartfelt anti-war sentiments that drew the audience to their feet.

Just minutes later, Nicole Kidman was almost as overcome by emotions as she was named the year's best actress for her self-effacing performance as the suicidal Virginia Woolf in "The Hours," produced by Paramount Pictures and Miramax.

Winning for her second nomination -- she was nominated last year for "Moulin Rouge" -- Nicole took a moment to compose herself. "Oh, Russell Crowe said, 'Don't cry if you get up there,' and now I am crying. Sorry," she said. Thanking director Stephen Daldry, writer David Hare and producer Scott Rudin, she moved on to acknowledge her family sitting before her. "I'm standing here in front of my mother and my daughter," she said. "And my whole life, I wanted to make my mother proud, and I want to make my daughter proud, so thank you."

In his opening monologue, show host Steve Martin made only passing reference to the fact that the Academy had rolled up the red carpet in an effort to tone down the glitz in a time of war. "That'll show them," Martin wryly said.

At first, the show looked as if it would brave its way through the blitz by adopting a carefree tone. A very pregnant Catherine Zeta-Jones -- who earned her troupier stripes by performing "Chicago's" nominated song, "I Move On," with co-star and fellow nominee Queen Latifah was almost immediately called back to the stage when she was chosen best supporting actress for her high strutting work in that

musical. "My hormones are too way out of control to be dealing with this," the actress said.

Chris Cooper scored a supporting actor Oscar for "Adaptation." It was the first nomination for the veteran character actor, who plays a rascally orchid enthusiast. He included a special tribute to his co-star Meryl Streep -- who also received a supporting nomination for her work in that film -- saying: "Working with this woman was like making great jazz. You had a lot to do with this, so thank you."

For the actors, it was a good year for the first timers. Adrian Brody, Chris Cooper and Catherine Zeta-Jones were first time nominees, and Nicole Kidman had only one previous nomination under her belt.

The "Chicago" parade started only 30 minutes into the broadcast, when the musical took the prize for art direction. Eventually, "Chicago" also picked up Oscars for its editing, Costume design and Sound.

The 5,816 Academy members appeared to adopt a very cosmopolitan stance this year when they honored Spanish Pedro Almodovar for his original screenplay for "Talk to Her". The film, which is a tale of two men who develop a friendship as they watch over their comatose girlfriends. "I want to dedicate this award to all the people who are raising their voices in favor of peace," Almodovar said in his acceptance.

The Academy awarded Salma Hayek's pet project "Frida" with 2 Oscars. The film based on documented life and love of Mexican painter Frida Kahlo won best make-up and best Score (original music written for the film).

Salma Hayek presented the best Foreign Language film award, which went to German entry "No where in Africa," directed by Caroline Link. The film tells of a Jewish family who fled to Africa during World War II.

The night's most polarizing moment came when controversial filmmaker Michael Moore climbed to the stage, accompanied by his wife, Kathleen Glynn, and his collaborator Michael Donovan, to accept the award for best documentary. Greeted by a standing ovation, he alienated many in the house when he proclaimed, "We are against this war." He expressed his voice by saying that Bush has to leave as his times up. He also questioned Bush's legitimacy of presidency.

The audience at the Kodak theater was generous in their standing ovations, though. They rose to their feet to welcome Julie Andrews, Olivia de Havilland and Peter O'Toole, who received an honorary Oscar. "I have my very own Oscar now to be with me until death do us apart," said the actor, who was nominated seven times without winning. "I wish the Academy to know I am as delighted as I am honored, and I am honored."

About Sitar and Surbahar

Indian Council for Cultural Relations and The High Commission of India, Dhaka Presented Sitar/ Surbahar recital by Jagdeep Singh Bedi and his troupe on March 17 at Muslim Institute, Chittagong and March 18 at the National Museum Auditorium, Dhaka.

In an enchanting spring evening a recital of sitar and surbahar made an illusory atmosphere when Jagdeep Singh Bedi, a sitarist and musician par excellence, made magical strokes on the instruments. As we listened to him we heard the intricacies of the sitar and surbahar which filled every nook and cranny of our heart. He has the rare skill excelling both in the sitar and the surbahar. He is a musician who plays under Senia Gharana or school.

Jagdeep played Puria Dhasneshri an evening melody on his surbahar. He played the Alap, Jor and Jhala as the audience became spellbound. The thaat was puravi and jate was shampurna which means all the seven notes were used. He played the Raga in dhrupad style where Sa was badi and Pa was shamabadi, Re and Dha was komal (soft) and Ma was tebra. The nature of the raga was restless and at times fiery. When he was playing the surbahar it felt that two lovers were being parted from each other and did not know when they would meet again. The internal craze and pathos of the lovers were revealed as Jagdeep played on.

Jagdeep played a very uncommon instrument like Surbahar. Surbahar evolved by modifying the sitar and rudra veena. Behind the creation of this instrument there is a small story. Ustad Umrao Khan of Kolkata used to play the rudra veena. There was a boy who looked after Ustad Umrao Khan. Many years had passed but he was never given a lesson on rudra veena. Traditionally the rudra veena was passed on to the sons only. But this ardent servant of his had keen interest music. On request from close ones Ustad Umrao Khan decided to give him lessons but not on rudra veena, so he developed a new instrument blending the sitar and rudra veena

which is now called surbahar. We are all aware of the popular instrument sitar but surbahar is a name uncommon to many of us. Jagdeep played it with utter dexterity.

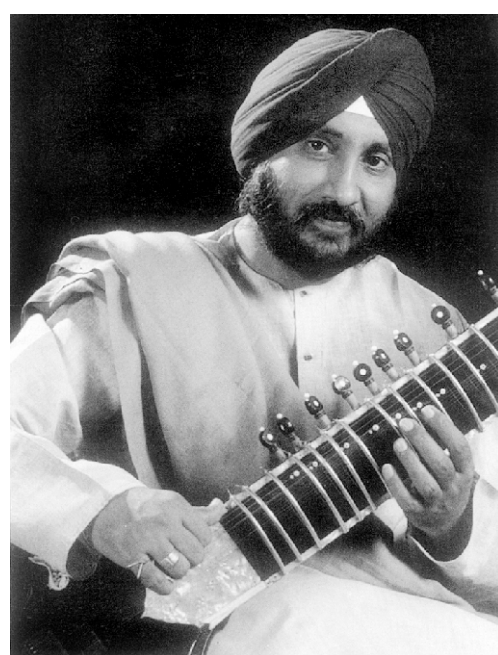
After playing the surbahar he played the sitar. He played Yamen, which is a Raga usually played at the first part of the night. The thaat was Yamen and its jati was shampurna. In the Raga Ma were tebra and the rest of the notes were natural which means it was shudhashar. The Ga was badi and Ni shamabadi. The ange of his playing is known as Gayaki. The mood of his playing was sad and at the same time cheerful. When he was playing the Raga Yamen on sitar it felt that the clouds were clustering around up above the sky and it was raining with a sweet rhythm.

After Raga Yamen Jagdeep played Raga Pilu on the sitar in thumri style. It is a spring time Raga played in a very romantic mood.

Jagdeep Sign Bedi's, initiation to the sitar and surbahar came through the rich experience of his father Shri Tara Sign Bedi, who is a sitarist, and vocalist, and a senior disciple of the late Pt. Krishnarao Shankar Pandit of the Gwalior Gharana.

Jagdeep's skills were honed and developed by the reputed sitar guru, Shri Anil Dhar, who imparted the intricacies of the sitar and surbahar in the style of the Senia Gharana and later by Shri Kalyan Mukharjee, senior disciple of Radhika Mohon Moitra. Jagdeep has also had extensive training under Shri Debashish Mukherjee, a sitarist of great proficiency.

Jagdeep has given stellar performances along with the best contemporary young musicians of the generation, starting with the

Navodit Kalal Samroh in 1985 and the Vishnu Digamber Jayanti in 1987. He was selected and sent for performances to the erstwhile USSR. As part of the Festival of India, and has since then been consistently invited at prestigious concerts. He was honoured with the Surmani Award for his performance in the Haridas Sangeet Sammelan.

Jagdeep is an accredited and acclaimed soloist with the All India Radio for both the sitar and surbahar. As a mark of his outstanding dual ability, 'Music of the World-USA' released an exclusive audio-cassette of his recital titled Soft and True. This has now been released worldwide as a compact disc.

Ustad Faiyaz Khan accompanied Jagdeep on Tabla and Yara Mohammed on tanpuras as Dahila Ahmed narrated about the programme. Ustad Faiyaz Khan, born in Rajasthan, took his first lessons from his father, then from Ustad Kawnd Ishvaran and finally from Ustad Enam Ali Khan of Delhi Gharana. He has performed solo and as accompanist all over India and also visited The United States to teach tabla.
