after her marriage she joined the Bangladesh Photography Society and also got a certificate from Film Institute of Bangladesh where she learned the language of film making.

From her childhood Reshmi was into going to different places with her video camera and bringing back pictures of the places she had visited. In case of her film "The Painful Cry" she had heard that an old building had sunk somewhat at Sahkhari Bazaar due to lack of maintenance. While she was there a "Sadhu" came to her and beckoned her to a widowed old woman. The old woman was delighted to meet Reshmi as she had seldom been allowed beyond the confines of her home. When she asked the widow about her life, she

expressed her internal pain in being lonely and abandoned. She was flattered and pleased on being discovered and filmed. She blessed Reshmi several times and spoke of her as "Bandhobi" for caring to portray the life of one so neglected and unheard of. This documentary on DV camera lasted about 7 minutes.

The second film, a docufiction on Beta consisting of about 24 minutes, has the theme of a frustrated housewife, who is weary of her monotonous life. Although an energetic and ambitious woman she feels she has achieved little in life. With her hus-

band and children away at work and school, she is portrayed as lonely and depressed. In this film, Javed Jalil, an artist talks of women power and their intrinsic superiority, which is portrayed through his paintings. Rabia Bhuiyan, a barrister, explains the psychological effect one can have on one's children, elaborating through personal experiences. Mehtab Khanam, a professor and mental health counselor gives examples from her personal life to portray the mental condition of a woman. Khanam also talks of how she has proved to be a good counselor. Parveen Ahmed, a woman activist, social worker, writer and researcher, talks of the position of

women in society and the history of the liberation of women. She emphasized her belief that every woman has a great responsibility in serving the world outside her home.

About this film Reshmi says, " This film 'Self Expression' is based on the plight of frustrated housewives. I have done quite a bit of research on this seeing the lifestyle of people around me. I project how they suffer from identity crisis. Next I have taken the opinion of some well-known women. The housewife that I focused on is Sanjida Aziz. I did not give any guide lines to the speakers in my film: I just requested them to say a few words of their own. Sanjida says that when she goes anywhere she feels pained that she cannot give her identity as any-

HIS was the 5th day of the week-long staging of drama arranged by Bangladesh Shilpokala Academy by theatre groups out of Dhaka at Showkat Osman Memorial Auditorium of the Public Library. Monu theatre from Moulovibazar staged a play, Sukhia Dukhia, based on the life of labourers of the tea-gardens in the region.

Tea is one of the leading means of earning foreign currency in Bangladesh. This artistry was intro-

duced by the English, some 200 years ago. This industry touched its boom period liquefying blood of the labourers whom we call porter. These credulous people migrated from Assam, Darjiling and from other places seeking better fortune with the beginning of tea gardens. They built up fortune for their master who changed with time. But these blunt subjects are still persecuted like hundred years ago. They are still victim of their master's hanker and lust. Cheating of Bangali, physical and mental torture by the English is their fate.

Still now the picture is same, only the way of harassment has changed in course of time. This is not a story but practical life of tea industry, and we should appreciate staging of this true story to the audience by some conscientious revolutionaries to strike human conscience with association of standard stage performance and choreography. 


