A Christian youth was stabbed to death by miscreants at village Sanakoir Purbopara in Sarisabari upazila on Wednesday night.

Police said miscreants, numbering 8-10, repeatedly stabbed Ridoy Roy, 32, of village Pingolkathi in Gouranadi upazila of Barisal, on his return home after showing movies through projectors at about 1pm. He reportedly involved in preaching Christianity by showing movies.
