



China have completed a clean sweep of all seven gold medals at the last two championships in Osaka (2001) and Eindhoven (1999), and anyone with an ounce of grey matter would be foolhardy to rule out of hand a third rout by the table tennis super power.

The Chinese arrived in the capital from their Caen training camp on Saturday and were immediately subjected to checks for any sign of the ŚARS virus.

"Everyone is fine, there's nothing to worry about," said Giu Shuging, the Chinese team doctor after examining the squad which includes Olympic champion Kong Linghui and world champions Wang Liqin and Wang Nan.


