# Seaman all at seas?

David Seaman agonised over whether to stay with Arsenal as a second choice goalkeeper or coach after spectacularly ensuring his side's victory in Saturday's FĂ Cup final

England international Seaman, who has spent 15 years with the Gunners, is no longer guaranteed a future as Arsenal's number one choice, manager Arsene Wenger reiterated after the 1-0 win here at the Millennium Stadium.

The veteran 'keeper pulled off a late save to stop Southampton scoring a late equaliser but that was never going to be enough to convince Wenger to keep faith with the keeper who will be 40 in September.

Although having declared Seaman "the best goalkeeper in England," the no-nonsense Frenchman is determined to freshen up his defence, including the man between the posts, ahead

of next season. Seaman, made captain for the season finale, left Cardiff without commenting on his future.

But according to Arsenal's goalkeeper coach, Bob Wilson, the

after Saturday's matches (played, won, drawn, lost, goals for, goals against, pony-tailed veteran - who is being linked with Manchester City - will decide his future direction in the next 48 hours

"He will make his decision tomorrow and Monday. But he will only keep playing if it is in the Premiership," said Wilson, a for-mer Arsenal keeper.

"If there is no interest from anywhere then he will stay with Arsenal.

With his team leading by just ne goal, Seaman pulled off a stunning reflex save from a Brett Ormerod shot 10 minutes from the end, parrying the ball across the face of the goal.

"I was sure it was going in," declared Ormerod

When asked about the shot, Seaman remained modest: "I just got my hand to it and luckily it staved out.

However despite Wenger's pport, Seaman's celebrations will be short-lived.

Wenger has made it clear that if he stays, Seaman will have to accept that a younger goalkeeper will be arriving in the summer. "We have already spoken and I

don't know when everything will be decided," said the manager. "I may keep him as number one or two but it is sure that he can no longer play 60 matches a season.

According to the manager, the only thing that is sure is that Seaman will eventually become Arsenal's goalkeeping coach.

Seaman has been one of the longest serving goalkeepers in the England national team.

But the writing was on the wall when he misjudged a lob by Ronaldinho and England went out of the World Cup last year to Brazil in the quarter final.

He remains a respected professional, however, and Wilson led the tributes to Seaman, who said the FA Cup victory had probably been a fitting end to a distinguished career at Highbury.

"It was a great way to finish. It could have been his last game, certainly for Arsenal," Wilson told reporters, before conceding that Wenger's ambition to win the Champions League meant that a new goalkeeper had to come to Highbury.

"Arsene's standards are so high. He wants power, youth and style. He wants the Champions League.

Wilson conceded that Seaman's kicking had gone astray recently but that his experience and calmness made him an attractive option

"Even though he makes a few mistakes there are still fewer than the others. He was born to be a great goalkeeper.

## The future starts here

There was palpable relief rather than triumph in the Arsenal camp after their 1-0 FA Cup final victory over Southampton at the Millennium Stadium.

There will be no ticker tape parade for Arsene Wenger and his players in London as there was after their Premiership and Cup double last year.

Arsenal dominated the final but as in the Premiership failed to deliver the killer blow against their opponents, giving Southampton hope right up to the final seconds.

And Wenger must now get down to his promised hunt for a new goalkeeper and defender to meet the demands of star players who have reportedly threatened to quit unless Arsenal can put up a stronger challenge against Premiership champions Manchester United next season.

"Arsenal now have a few weeks to listen to the players and lay the basis for the future," said Robert Pires the goalscorer in the 1-0 victory before 73,725 people at the Millennium stadium in Cardiff on Saturday.

Wenger confirmed after the victory that Premiership player of the year Thierry Henry has signed a new contract and expressed confi-dence that fellow Frenchmen Pires and Patrick Vierra, the team captain, would sign within a couple of weeks.

But David Seaman, who pulled off a dramatic save from a Brett Ormerod shot 10 minutes from the end to keep Southampton at bay, has been left fighting for his future even though Wenger said Seaman is "still the best goalkeeper in England."

Seaman, who will be 40 in September, must decide whether to stay and possibly play a secondary role before joining the coaching staff or move to a new team if the right offer is made

Central defender Martin Keown, who will be 37 in July, may also struggle to feature in Wenger's plans from now on.

Dutch star Dennis Bergkamp, who was 34 on Sunday, hopes to renegotiate a new deal. "When you look around you don't see so many teams with this quality," he said.

But anticipating changes, he added: "It is always healthy for a club to get some new players, some fresh players.

The whole team was stunned by the way in which they gave up a handsome lead in the Premiership and gave up the title to United. "At Arsenal you always have to

win something and if you don't win it is a failure," added Pires. "It would have been really

difficult to finish without a trophy, said Henry, who was named player of the match even though referee Graham Barber booked him for diving in the Southampton pen-

"What a pleasure to win something. Not to have won would have been a massive disappointment." Wenger insisted he was

delighted at the way the team reacted to the blow of losing the Premiership title. "The last three weeks have been

difficult but the players have been tremendous," the French manager "It's a different competition to

the Premiership and we are of course disappointed to have not won the Premiership - we were very, very close to a double-double. "However, if you look at last two

seasons we have won two Cups and a title and finished runners-up in

the championship," he added Arsenal's goalkeeping coach Bob Wilson, a star of one of Arsenal's first double winning team, said it was Wenger's ambition to win the Champions League that had put Seaman's place at threat. "His standards are so high,'

> said Wilson. Southampton, who had goaleeper Antti Niemi stretchered off, left Cardiff disappointed at not pulling off a repeat of their famous win in the 1976 final against Manchester United. But manager Gordon Strachan is determined not to let it weaken their challenge in the Premiership or Europe next vear.

On top of Ormerod's bullet like strike from close in which Seaman somehow parried across the face of the goal, star Saints striker James Beattie also had chances

"We are all disappointed," said Beattie who like most other mem-bers of his team paid tribute to Southampton's travelling fans. "They were outsinging the Arsenal fans even though we lost he said.'

Beattie, the top scoring Englishman in the Premiership, as pledged his immediate future to Southampton but has admitted that he may soon be looking for a new club that can meet his ambitions to play in the Champions League.

"On a lucky day we could have won," declared Strachan who will spend the summer looking for less expensive additions to his squad than Wenger.

"I know from a player's point of view my players have done something great and it's a magnificient experience to be have qualified for the UEFA Cup.

Everton's teenage sensation Wayne Rooney was on Sunday forced to withdraw from England's squad for Thursday's friendly against South Africa in Durban putting an end to a row which had erupted between the club manager David Moves and England coach Sven-Goran Eriksson.

The England medical staff together with Everton's physio assessed the 17-year-old striker's knee injury in London and agreed the player should return to his club for treatment.

"It was agreed that Wayne will remain with Everton for the remainder of the week with a view to joining the England squad with a trip to La Manga," said a statement by the Football Association (FA). Eriksson and Moyes were also

present at the examination. Meanwhile Liverpool's Danny Murphy has had to withdraw from all three of England's summer
