4 killed in another suicide bombing in northern Israel

Four people were killed Monday when a suicide bombing ripped through the entrance of a shopping centre in the northern Israeli town of Afula, Israeli television reported.

At least 14 people were wounded in the blast, which Israeli media said may have been carried out by a woman.

A worse bloodbath was averted when the security guard posted at the entrance of the mall apparently prevented the bomber from enter-

The hardline Palestinian group Islamic Jihad claimed responsibility for this bombing in a telephone call to AFP here.

The bombing in Afula, which lies around 10 kilometres north of the northern West Bank city of

against Israeli targets in 48 hours.

Another suicide bomber wounded three Israeli soldiers yesterday in the Gaza Strip, after the government clamped a total closure on the Palestinian territories and moved to isolate Yasser Arafat further.

A Palestinian riding a bicycle detonated his explosives as an army jeep passed near the Jewish settlement of Kfar Darom in the Gaza Strip early, Israeli military sources said.

The bombing was claimed by the hardline Islamic group Hamas, which was also responsible for an attack on settlers in the West Bank city of Hebron and the two blasts which killed nine people including the bombers in

Jerusalem Sunday.

Token hunger strike for **Khosru** in Chittagong

Agitating journalists yesterday observed a day-long token hunger strike at Chittagong Press Club demanding immediate rescue of abducted fellow media man Atahar Siddiqui Khosru.

Sitakunda Press Club and Chittagong Journalist Forum jointly staged the agitation as a part of a fresh 5-day programme. A rally also took place during the strike.

Speakers expressed their concern over the condition of Khosru who remained untracked even 20 days after his abduction on April

They also strongly condemned the police role, alleging them for protecting the suspects and harassing journalists.

Khosru is the president of Sitakunda press club and a correspondent of Bengali daily Ittefaq.

New road tech can save Tk 1,000 crore a year

A mix of cement and brick aggregates to form the base of paving can make roads durable and save up to Tk 1,000 crore a year, speakers told a seminar vesterday.

The seminar on Cost Effective Improvement of Bangladesh Roads, organised by the Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh (IEB), asked the government to carry out a test on the new way of road building. Assistant Engineer of the Roads and Highways Department

(RHD) SM Shafiqul Alam presented the keynote paper on the

Bangladesh spends more than Tk 3,500 crore on the growing road network, but the roads wear out easily because of tropical weather,

Floodwater seeps through the bituminous surface of roads and destroys them, as engineers now use only brick aggregates in the base of pavement, he said.
