



Arsenal are reported to be set to make a 10 million pound (15 million dollar) move for Australian internationals Harry Kewell and Brett Emerton.

The London Evening Standard reported Monday that Emerton was the key because if Arsenal sign him from Dutch club Fevenoord for around 4 million pounds that will allow them to offer Leeds Ray Parlour plus about 6 million pounds for Kewell.

The 24-year-old Emerton was watched by Arsenal as his Feyenoord side lost the Dutch Cup Final 4-1 to Utrecht in Rotterdam on Sunday and the Standard said manager Arsene Wenger will make a decision when he returns from holiday later this week.

Emerton, who has scored five times in 27 games for his country, joined the Dutch club three years ago. He wants to come to England but has resisted interest from

Newcastle and Middlesbrough because he is not keen on moving to the north-east. Both Emerton and Kewell are in
