Our Gopalganj Correspondent reported that housewife Kazal was murdered allegedly by her husband Sabu Sheikh at village Manikdaha under Gopalgani Sadar over a family feud Monday night.

On the night of the incident, they quarreled and at one stage Sabu hit her with a hammer causing her instantaneous death A case was filed with Gopalgan

Our Kushtia Correspondent reported that a maternal uncle killed his six-year-old nephew at Bhatapara on the outskirt of Kushtia town on Monday night.

According to police and the victim's family, Abdur Razzak, 27 allegedly belonging to an outlawed party went to his sister's house at Bhetapura on Monday and demanded Tk 5,000. But sister Kaniz refused.
