Henin-Hardenne won 6-0, 6-4 in 1hr 7min to become the first ever Belgian Grand Slam champion on a sunny Philippe Chatrier Centre Court.

She picked up a winner's cheque of 819,000 euros (967,000 dollars) whereas Clijsters as finalist received half that sum.

French speaker Henin, who received the trophy from King Albert II and who dedicated her success to her late mother Francoise, the inspiration behind her career, was almost speechless at the end. "I really don't know what to say.




Spanish third seed Juan Carlos Ferrero goes into the trophy match as the last man standing among the huge Spanish claycourt armada.
