Bills to hike perks for PM, speaker, MPs placed

Four bills were placed in the parliament yesterday proposing over 40 to 600 per cent rise in perks to the prime minister, speaker, deputy speaker, ministers, state ministers deputy ministers and members of parliament.

If the bills are passed, the recipients would get enhanced benefits with retrospective effect from July 1,

Cabinet again fails to make decision

Issue to be discussed in party forum

The cabinet is to finalise whether the upazila system would be revived or not through fresh discussion with lawmakers of the ruling party and its leaders at all tiers.

The weekly meeting of the cabinet yesterday witnessed a lengthy and heated debate on the issue but again failed to make a decision, meeting sources said.

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia chaired the meeting.

Revival of upazila system is a major election pledge of the BNP but several influential ministers apprehensive of conflict between MPs and upazila chairmen oppose it.

They have decided to bring out processions and stage demonstrations at all the thana, district and

educational institutions today.

The BCL chalked out a sevenday programme demanding immediate arrest and trial of Palash's killers. A further four-day programme will be declared by June 19, sources said.

BCL city secretary gunned down

Unidentified gunmen killed a Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) leader in an apparent revenge attempt that also left a physically challenged young man dead in Kalyanpur yesterday afternoon.

Saiful Rasul Palash nicknamed SR Palash, 32, City (north) BCL general secretary and former vicepresident of BCL Dhaka College unit, was declared dead on arrival at Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) at about 4:15 pm.

A disabled Basir Ahmed, 22, peon of the bus-service provider Sony Enterprise, died instantly in

Robbers loot Nawabpur markets
