## **Killers of Momtaz** still at large

**Bills to hike perks**

Six main suspects for the murder of Awami League (AL) leader Momtaz

Uddin Ahmed are at large. They are Alam, Moti, Babu, Shamim, Sujon and Aslam of Lalpur. Local people claimed some of the suspects were seen moving freely in the area while police said

they were chasing the abscondees. Although the victim's brother Abul Kalam Azad had not accused anyone specific, witnesses said the six persons and three unidentified men aided by seven others commit ted the murder

The majority of the six are also accused in other cases, sources

said. According to plaintiff Azad, some ruling party cadres allegedly threat-ened Momtaz on June 2 when he decided to challenge the withdrawal of the names of the accused from the Khannas murder case.

private banks in four divisional cities of Dhaka, Chittagong, Sylhet and Khulna are better equipped in terms of security measures. They have hired private security companies to take care of the security.

But the remaining 4,850 branches of public and specialised banks are very vulnerable. These banks deploy their own quards.

"As there is a shortage of guards in public banks, many are virtually on duty for 24 hours." said a source. "This itself threatens the quality of security they are providing.'

The situation appears even looting and heist, all banks are now bleaker now as evidences suggest taking steps to beef up security. As per some of these quards are involved in a Bangladesh Bank advice last year theft and robbery at their own all banks have already taken some branches. They are also involved in steps. mugging outside, bankers said.

Talking to The Daily Star. leading bankers admitted that there were many incidents where the bank guards themselves were involved in bank robbery and mugging.

Pubali Bank Managing Director Khandker Ibrahim Khaled said, "Our study on our security does not show lapses. The bank can do nothing it there is a robbery in broad daylight." He indicated that the banks are helpless when the law and order keeps deteriorating.

The furious Teesta, Surma and Kushiara rivers erased large swathes of dozens of villages in the districts, forcing people to take refuge on embankments and on higher ground.

Our Lalmonirhat correspondent Sheola in Beanibazar. adds: The Teesta affected Hatibandha, Aditmari and Sadar

of six additional judges, the attorney general argued citing Article 48 of the Constitution.

Seeking leave to appeal against the High Court order, he submitted that appointment of judges is an exclusive domain of the executive. The question of looking into the recommendation of the chief justice in this context is irrelevant for determining the primary question of deciding the necessity of such recommendation.

Referring to Article 48 of the Constitution, the attorney general argued that the president appoints a judge on the prime minister's advice. Recommendation of the chief justice being a part of the process comes under the protection of Article 48 that made the advice mmune from inquiry by any court. Opposing the attorney general's

arguments, the counsel for the petitioners Barrister Ajmalul

Hossain submitted that the pertinent issue is whether the document is relevant. The privilege of the executive as provided in Article 48(3) is irrelevant in this case.

"As lawyers, we normally regard a document as relevant if it supports the case," argued the counsel.

He went on saying that when a document is not produced or objected to on grounds of privilege, it is tantamount to hiding facts jeopardising the interest of the aggrieved petitioner.

The cloak of privilege is misused on many occasions and is being misused in this case as well. observed the counsel.

The Chief Justice Mainur Reza Chowdhury held himself aloof from the bench for his involvement by way of submission of the recommendation. Six other judges of the Appellate Division heard the case.

The inconclusive hearing resumes today.
