Mother unhappy with verdict on **Bushra killing**

Mother of slain student Rushdania Islam Bushra yesterday expressed her dissatisfaction over the verdict of her daughter.

"All the accused had hands in killing my daughter but some of them escaped," Laila Islam, mother of Bushra said at her Hazipara residence. She said she heard the verdict but it fell short of her expectation. She wished all the accused got capital punishment.

"My family turned into a mess following Bushra's killing," Laila

A tribunal in Dhaka yesterday sentenced three persons to death and one to life imprisonment in its verdict on the killing of Rushdania Islam Bushra, a college student.

The convicts with death sentence are M Abdul Kader, former relief and social welfare secretary of the Awami League city unit, Sheikh Shawkat Ahmed Ruhul and Sheikh Kabir Ahmed. Kabir has been absconding since the 18year-old marketing student of City

College was raped and killed in Hazipara on June 1, 2000

Anti-outlaw drive within week

Jubo Dal leader, criminal gunned down in city

A top criminal of Shyampur was gunned down at Jurain yesterday and a Jubo Dal leader was shot dead at Banglabazar Sunday night.

Monjurul Hossain alias Bonda, a criminal on the list of the Shyampur Police Station, was killed due to internal feud, police believe.

The killing took place at around 9:00am vesterday when the 35-yearbrother's residence at Dhalkanagar

When he reached West Jurain graveyard, four armed youths opened fire on him.

Several bullets hit Bonda in his right hand palm, face and abdo-

Policemen patrolling some 400 vards away rushed to the spot hearing the gunshots and found Bonda

He was taken to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where doctors declared him dead.

His brother Miraj said Bonda moved out from his Dhalkanagar residence last year fearing attacks Commissioner Shahid of Old Dhaka with whom he had enmity.

CJ recommends job confirmation of 9 addl judges

Chief Justice KM Hasan has recommended confirmation of nine additional judges, law ministry sources said

President Iajuddin Ahmed will now take a decision regarding the judges in consultation with Prime Minister Khaleda Zia by tomorrow As an age-old convention, the

chief justice recommends on the performance of additional judges to absorb them in service perma-

The nine judges took oath for a wo-year term each on July 3, 2001.

A group of policymakers want to confirm services of eight of them to overcome the public impression that the judiciary is increasingly becoming a subject of political intervention, according to ruling

But another group is against the confirmation of at least six of the udges who previously were lawyers on the ground that they were political appointees of the Awami League government. Since the other three came from the judicial cadre, they may be retained, the faction views.

Saifur talks of new law to force tax disclosure

Finance and Planning Minister M Saifur Rahman vesterday told the Jatiya Sangsad that a fiscal responsibility act would be passed to enforce disclosure of the amount of taxes paid by businessmen and professionals.

Referring to large-scale tax evasion by them, he said they name mama shashuri, khala shashuri (mothers-in-law) as the sources of

The minister made the comments in his closing speech on the proposed budget for the fiscal 003-2004 in the Jatiya Sangsad.

Referring to the amendment to self-assessment system of income tax, he said many, especially lawyers, criticised the proposal. He said the proposal was made

to bring an end to the self-assessment system abused widely

Many businessmen and professionals took to their advantage the system to submit much less taxes although they earn crores of taka.

IDA to provide \$236m credit

UNB, Dhaka

Bangladesh will get \$236.12 million, equivalent to Tk 1,369.50 crore, as credit from the International Development Association (IDA) for implementing three projects.

Separate agreements in this regard were signed here yesterday between the government and the DA, the soft loan window of the World Bank.

An official handout said ERD (Economic Relations Division) Secretary Mirza Tasadduq Hossain Beg and outgoing World Bank Country Director Frederick T Temple signed the agreements.

Under one agreement, the IDA

will provide a credit of \$190 million, equivalent to Tk 1,102 crore, for Rural Transport Improvement Project (RTIP) in Bangladesh.

The credit carries a service charge of three-fourths of one per cent a year repayable in 40 years including a 10-year grace.

The Local Government Engineering Department would execute the project over a period of five years commencing next September.

The objectives of the project are to provide rural communities with improved access to social services and economic opportunity and enhance the capacity of relevant
