In Sirajganj, about 30,000 people are marooned in char areas in five upazilas as Jamuna, Boral and Korotoa rivers continued to rise due to onrush of waters from upstream areas in India.

Normally, a plant for a family produces 150 CFT of gas, which costs Tk 11,000, of which government gives Tk 5,000, official

The country's biggest bio-gas plant is at the house of one Abdus . Salam at Pachok village in Naria Upazila, which produces 500 CFT

Salam has provided six gas connections to neighbors. Salam's family is now using hajack lamp by using bio-gas

He uses the organic fertiliser, a by-product, as fish feed in four

Rural people are demanding increase in the government subsidy and installation of plants in remote areas. Installation of biogas plant in the district started in 1996.
