Tk 233 cr Barisal City **Corpn Budget**

The highest allocation of Tk 100 core has been kept for development of the newly included areas of BCC.

Other allocations include Tk 45 core for water supply, Tk 11 core for health care projects, Tk 10 crore for master plan and beautification, Tk five crore for children's park, Tk 10 crore for housing, Tk 1 core for setting up of a zoo and Tk two crore

for truck terminals.
