## PM assures trial of killers

Slain Sramik Dal leader Shafi's wife meets Khaleda Zia

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia yesterday assured the family members of slain Jatiyatabadi Sramik Dal leader Shafi Ahmed of trial of the killers under the Speedy Trial Act.

Her assurance came when wife and children of freedom fighter Shafi called on her at the Prime Minister's Office (PMO). Shafi was killed allegedly by the

Awami League activists on June 14 at his Chittagong residence. Khaleda Zia said measures were

taken for trial and punishment to the killers as per law of the land. No one would be spared if found guilty of the murder, she added. Expressing her deep condo-lence at the death of Shafi, who

used to work in railway in Chittagong, and sympathy to the members of the bereaved family, the prime minister handed over a cheque for Tk one lakh to Shafi's wife Masuda Begum for meeting immediate needs of the family.

Shafi's son AKM Tareq and daughter Firoza Begum Nipa were

## 39 working women raped in 6 months

BILS survey reveals

At least 39 working women and girls in different industrial sectors and services were raped in first six months of the current year, reveals a survey.

Seven of them were brutally killed after the rape.

Bangladesh Institute of Labour Studies (BILS) conducted the survey on the basis of the reports published in different national dailies.

Of the total victims, 18 were garment workers, 11 domestic helps, six construction labourers and four in other sectors.

The survey attributed the incidents primarily to late night work and lack of transportation facilities.

In the case of domestic workers, cruelty of house masters, wives and their sons was responsible for the
