Nigeria to back Bangladesh

Post of OIC Secretary General

Nigeria has extended full support to Bangladesh's candidature for the post of OIC Secretary General.

Outgoing High Commissioner of Nigeria in Dhaka, Abdullahi Madaki Bage conveyed his country's support to Bangladesh's candidature for the top post of OIC when he had a farewell call on Prime Minister Khaleda Zia at her office yesterday.

The envoy also assured the prime minister that Nigeria would also help Bangladesh to garner support from other OIC member countries for winning the position.

Bangladesh nominated Prime Minister's Parliamentary Affairs Advisor Salauddin Quader Chowdhury MP as the candidate for the post of OIC Secretary General.

Khaleda Zia also requested the Nigerian High Commissioner to import jute and jute goods, pharmaceutical products, leather items and agro-products from Bangladesh.

Some 28 Nigerian students are now taking training at the Textile Technology Institute in Chittagong. Some are also taking training in the garment industry in Bangladesh, Madaki Bage apprised the prime minister.

sign for economic uplift.
