Lawyers don't need trade licences, says Amir-Ul

Bangladesh Bar Council Vicechairman Barrister Amir-Ul Islam yesterday called upon lawyers to join daylong countrywide court boycott programme on August 6 for the realisation of their six-point

He condemned 'the government move to make submission of income tax return mandatory and to introduce trade licences for law professionals'.

"Lawyers do not need have trade licences as they don't buy or sale commodities, the certificate of the Bar Council is enough for them," he

"Lawyers won't take trade licence in any case," Islam said while speaking at a press conference organised by the Implementation Council of the Sixpoint demands of Lawyers at the Supreme Court Lawyers Association office.

He said separation of the judiciary still remained a far cry despite repeated demands by lawyers and directives by the highest court.
