Britain's Tim Henman ended a 19month ATP title drought here Sunday, defeating Chilean fourth seed Fernando Gonzalez 6-3, 6-4 in the final of the 600.000-dollar Washington Classic.

In his first tour final since last vear at Queen's, 38th-ranked Henman weathered a pair of rain delays and the hard-hitting style of his South American foe for his first title since January of 2002 at Adelaide.

Henman, who lost six of his first eight matches of the year after right shoulder surgery last November, won his 10th career title in his first hardcourt final since last year at Indian Wells. "I lost a couple of finals in the

United States, so I was keen to get a win on American soil and my 10th title, so it's a special day for me," Henman said. Gonzalez, coming off a semi-

final upset of world number one Andre Agassi that he called the greatest win of his career, fell to 2-2 lifetime against Henman but will have a chance to avenge the loss rather quickly.

"We play in the first round next week at Montreal, so he will have a chance at revenge," Henman said.
