Expert predicts landslide, wants evacuation from banks of Karnaphuli

Two mild tremors yesterday shook Barkal and areas nearby in Rangamati in the latest of aftershocks from a series of powerful earthquakes that caused no serious damage but raised call for

The latest aftershocks rattled Barkal at 4:00am and then at 9:30am, fraying further the nerves of local residents who had been living in a state of panic since the quake first struck on July 27.

Geologists and earthquake

termed the train of tremors prologue to a huge disaster and urged the government to start relocating about 40,000 indigenous and nonindigenous residents soon.

After two days of investigation, experts have ascertained the Kolabunia area of Barkal the epicentre of the earthquake.

But Aftab Alam Khan, one of the experts and teacher at the geology department at Dhaka University told newsmen yesterday he does not see the possibility of any major quake hitting the area soon

Talking at the office of

he however predicted few landslides in the area. He also said the government should begin evacuating people living on the banks of the Karnaphuli river at Kolabunia bazaar and suburbs

Two acres of land at Kolabunia. which was 15 feet above the water level, went down 35 feet beneath the Karnaphuli river over the past 10 days.

The geo-physical observatory recorded 49 tremors between July 27 and August 5 in the Chittagong region. The July 27 quake lasted about 20 seconds and measured

series of aftershocks did the most damage in the Barkal area, causing landslide and 'fault line' in the tremor-prone hills district.

Meanwhile, a team from the Bangladesh Power Development Board has been investigating whether the country's biggest dam and hydropower plant in Kaptai is at risk now.

Earlier, geologists warned if the quake had weakened the structure of the dam it might fell apart possibly in the next guake. Thousands of families will become homeless instantly, they said.

AKTEL yesterday slashed call tariff from 33 up to 50 per cent for its different mobile phone packages.

Telecom Malaysia International Bangladesh (TMIB), the service provider of AKTEL, has reduced tariff to Tk 2 from Tk 3 per minute for Mobile Plus and Mobile Link pack-

This is 33 per cent less than the previous rate, the TMIB's General Manager (Marketing) Yussli Yusoff told reporters at a press conference in Dhaka.

He said the company has also lowered the charges for inter-zonal calls generating to other operators' mobile phones by 33 per cent.

Besides, the monthly rent was reduced by 20 and 17 per cent for

Mobile Link and Mobile Plus packages, he added.

AKTEL has also offered each subscriber 50 per cent reduced call charges for three numbers.

The company has also launched a new campaign to draw more subscribers. Announcing the tariff cut and new campaign "AKTEL Reach Out", Yusoff said AKTEL will continue to reduce call charges and offer more attractive packages in future to increase its subscribers base with better service.

Yusoff said the company has introduced a 'Night Bird Talk Plan'

Tata offers cell phones at Rs 999

India's Tata group entered the mobile telephone sector yesterday by launching a scheme selling cell phones for an upfront price of 999 rupees (21.65 dollars).

Tata Teleservices, the group's telecoms subsidiary, introduced its mobile wireless in local loop (WLL) service in the western Indian state of Maharashtra offering cheap longterm tariff plans.

Customers have to pay 199 rupees a month for two years to pay back the cost of the handset, among other charges.

The initial entry price is double that of competitor Reliance, which last month announced a special package that brought down the entry cost for its mobile to 10 dollars, with the customer paying 100 rupees per month for three years.

The offer was snapped up by college students, taxi drivers and housewives.

"We have entered late in the mobile sector and we also are not making big promises of offering cheapest services, but we are definitely going to offer the best value for money service," said Tata's

chief operating officer, Y.V.L. Pandit. He said over three years a Tata mobile phone user would see at least 20 percent savings in tariff costs compared to a Reliance subscriber on the basis of a lower pulse rate and lower per minute

ANM Mohiuddin, investigation officer (IO) of the case, accused seven persons under 302/342/120(Kha) of Section

Putul Barua, a teacher of Hingala Owara Puinya Bouddha Bihar, Alaichh Mohammad, Azizul Huq, Nurul Islam, Gias, Manik and Zahur are the accused in the case.

Thirty-seven were made witnesses in the case
