The Board named former national captain Faruque Ahmed as chief selector when it announced a three-member national selection committee yesterday. Athar Ali Khan, a former national opener, and GM Nowsher Prince are the other members of the new panel.

Among the three contemporary cricketers, who represented the country during the 90s, left-arm paceman Prince has served as a selector of the previous committee headed by Aliul Islam.

Aliul, who was at the centre of controversy during his nearly yearlong reign, resigned immediately after announcing the Bangladesh squad for Australia on June 14.

However, the formation of a new panel fulfilled the Board's commitment to follow the prescription of the much-talked-about probe report on Bangladesh's disastrous performance in the South Africa World Cup early this year.

The two-member probe commitee led by Commodore Mojibur Rahman in its sensational findings recommended that it would ideal if selectors were chosen from exnational players who have good knowledge of the goings of local cricket and a better understanding of the present cricketers.

Faruque, 37, and Athar are not only very prominent names among the present cricketers but also have


