Pakistan captain Rashid Latif on Wednesday was very impressed by Bangladesh's first innings performance. He thought it was nothing like what he had seen in their previous three meetings.

"Bangladesh have really surprised me. Watching them bat from behind the stumps they looked more confident than what I saw in January 2002. I'm quite excited seeing a fourth Test-playing team from the sub-continent become so competitive," said the local hero who became Pakistan captain for the second time earlier this year.

Speaking at the Karachi Sheraton Hotel, the 34-year-old wicketkeeper believed Bangladesh coach Dav Whatmore deserved full credit for injecting a newfound confidence into the Test babes in such a short period of time.

"I don't want to comment on Habibul Bashar because he is the only consistent performer in your team. But the way Hannan (Sarker) and Alok (Kapali) batted, it gave me the impression that Bangladesh are following the correct path," he said.

Latif obviously knows what he is talking about since he is running a cricket academy in Karachi, which has produced players like Younis Khan Farhan Adil and pacer Mohammad Sami for the national

### RAMEEZ SPEAKS OUT

Rameez Raja is unhappy at the way Mohsin Kamal was dumped as coach by the Bangladesh Cricket Board.

"Let me make one point very clear the BCB didn't do justice to Mohsin Kamal, I didn't like the way he was ousted. The Bangladesh cricket authorities opted for Kamal and Ali Zia after interviewing them. The PCB didn't have a thing to do about it," said Raja at the Karachi National Stadium during the second day's play.

But when this correspondent reminded him of Bangladesh's worst performances under Kamal, the PCB chief executive changed his tune.

"I guess because of the disastrous performance in the World Cup, the axe had to fall on somebody and it was the captain and the coach I think," said Raja.

They also said that Kamal was Raja's best fried and it was Raja who forwarded his name to the Bangladesh board from the PCB.
