Japan will receive 106 Bangladeshi students this year under its Monbukagakusho (popularly known as Monbusho) scholarship programme and a small number of programme, Japanese Embassy sources said. Fellowship (AYF), sources said.

The students will stay in Japan with full scholarships for one to five years under the higher studies programmes at different universities to complete their post-graduation and PhD courses. Last year, 125 students went to
