Instability shoots up prices of essentials

Over the last one year prices of essentials have risen by 8.52 per cent, according to a survey. Experts believe government could play a vital role in controlling prices

Everyday living expenses in Dhaka have increased consistently throughout the year, a survey by the Consumers Association of Bangladesh (CAB) reveals an 8.52 per cent increase for the year. In the year 2001 it was

The Government's lack of transparency concerning information in different sectors, fluctuation of the dollar and the inconsistent weather patterns has contributed to the instability of the market price.

Government officials claim the rice market has been relatively stable for the last six months, which has been confirmed by the retail and wholesale traders of the city. The price of IRRI has been Tk. 14 to Tk. 14.50 for several months.

There has been a relative price increase of 3.82 percent for the year 2003 when compared with the market price of June 2002, said the CAB.

Though Pijam is down (-8.33 %), Kataribhog, Jhinga, and Najirshail had an average raise of 5.55%. IRRI and Aaus increased 3.5 per cent; while Jamir took a huge jump of 11.53 per cent.

"All governments during their term claim self sufficiency in meeting the needs of the country in rice production. Nevertheless, these statements always prove to be highly dubious." said Emdad Hossain Malek, a

" At the end of the year governments com-

monly reveal that they had imported a certain amount of rice. For the year 2002-2003 it was revealed that almost 35 lakh metric tons of rice was imported."

A government official, on condition of anonymity, backed those findings, "The present government showed (on papers) that they made a surplus of 20 lakh metric tons of rice last year. The previous government was little ahead putting it at 30 lakh metric tons." "If this information is correct, there should have been a price cut for rice, and there would not have been a need to import any rice in those years. The price would have dropped to Tk. 9 per kilogram," the official added.

"Farmers and traders never have a concrete idea of the amount of rice the country has or needs, though the total market could be controlled by them," said Malek.

The production of wheat and Aaous paddy is lower than the expectation due to rain, said Ramiz Ullah, a retail trader at Tongi Bazar. This may hamper the price to a degree, he stated. The price of flour (red) increased by 7.69 percent from last year and Shuji by 36.36 per cent, said CAB.

It is an added irony that the price of spices has decreased by 11.57 % this year. "Smuggling is the reason for the decrease in the price of spices which come from India and Burma illegally," said Malek.

The price of garlic, ginger, cumin (jira), almond, aniseed and cinnamon have decreased by 20.0 %, 15.0 %, 46.15 %, 50.0 % and 16.67 % respectively.

On contrary red (dried) chilli and turmeric

have increased by 28.57 % and 16.66 %.

Though the price of onion was inconsistent, now it is stable at a higher rate of Tk. 18 to Tk. 22, for local veriety, and the imported ones are at Tk. 17 to Tk. 18. Specialists assume that this may rise soon during Ramadan.



the protein requirements for the whole country are now at risk of extinction, specialists claim. The increase in the price of poultry feed is the reason, says a poultry businessman. The price of beef has increased to Tk. 100

per kilogram. Sellers said that the imported meat is less than the demand in the market. Traders claimed that the Value Added Tax (VAT) has been increased.

The fluctuations of dollar are also a reason for the instability of market price, said Malek. Since most of the ingredients of everyday needs are imported the market price is inextricably linked with international trade.

Bookbinders cry for rights

Bookbinders at a demonstration in the city on Sunday demanded that the government cancel a tender that 'denies' their right to binding textbooks.

The Bangladesh Bookbinding Owners-Labourers Union protested the National Curriculum and Textbook Board's publication of the tender in newspapers on September 3 that asked printing press owners instead of the bookbinders to submit quotations.

The demonstrators tried to submit a

memorandum to the textbook board chairman, Professor Kabir Uddin Ahmed, but he did not allow them to enter the building in Motijheel. At a meeting between bookbind-

ers and the education ministry officials, held at the textbook board on October 5, 2002, it was decided that all tenders for bookbinding should be awarded to the binders, Moksedur Rahman Khan, the union convenor, recalled

State Minister for Education ANM Ehsanul Hag chaired the meeting, also attended by State Minister for Water Resources Goutam Chakraborty,

Deputy Minister for Education Abdus Salam Pintu, and the textbook board chairman, among others According to the decision, 45 book-

binders would be able to participate in the government tender this year and another 213 will be allowed to take part in the tender in 2004.

But the chairman did not go by the decision of the education ministry and invited the press owners to participate in tender bidding, shutting the bookbinders out of their right to binding government textbooks, complained the union convenor.
