Most of the classes were not held as the teachers belonging to the JUTA did not take any classes Some teachers having link with



Chief Patron of the Stranded Pakistanis General Repatriation Committee (SPGRC) M Nasim Khan told a press conference at the National Press Club here yesterday that about 250,000 people of the community have been languishing in different camps across Bangladesh in a subhuman conditions for decades now.

More than 32 years have elapsed after the independence of Bangladesh, when they were left behind after the war, and many Pakistani leaders gave them assurances about repatria-

Musharraf also gave us assurance of looking into the matter during his visit to Dhaka last year. But nothing came out of that as yet, Nasim

Khan said. "I'll fight till my last for the cause," said the 82-yeard-old Khan, who, in last 30 years, have negotiated many times with leaders of Bangladesh and Pakistan and also with different international organisations for the repatriation of the Pakistanis from here. The stranded Pakistanis. better

known as Biharis, opted to go to Pakistan after the independence of Bangladesh in 1971.

Only about two lakh of them could go till 1993 while over 250,000 others are living in different camps in Dhaka, Chittagong, Svedpur, Rangpur and other areas Nasim Khan appealed to Prime
