England must learn the lessons of their drawn Test series with South Africa or risk coming unstuck on their upcoming tour of Bangladesh, skipper Michael Vaughan warned on Tuesday.

Only a dramatic turnaround in the final Test enabled England to draw their series with the South Africans and Vaughan was quick to point out the dangers of underestimating their next opponents.

"We've made mistakes in the series, we all know that. We must really learn from those mistakes, Vaughan told Sky Sports News. "Bangladesh will be a tough test,

they are a learning team. I fully

expect us to go there and win but I don't underestimate the task we've got ahead of us."

One player Vaughan will expect much from is Andrew Flintoff, who he sees as a potential England great


