

Five goals in any Champions League match is not to be sniffed at. But Panathinaikos were so poor that this was not a performance that will necessarily have the likes of AC Milan and Real Madrid fretting about the prospect of meeting the David Beckham-less United later in the tournament

United secured a stranglehold on the game with two goals in the space of as many minutes just before the quarter-of-an-hour mark.

The new campaign might have started in even more spectacular fashion but for a lapse in Ruud van Nistelrooy's clinical touch in front of goal after just 40 seconds.

Organizers of the Women's World Cup were keeping a wary eye on Isabel, the hurricane bearing down on the US East Coast just days before the opening matches Saturday in Philadelphia and Columbus, Ohio.

"It's on our radar," US Soccer Federation spokesman David Applegate told AFP. "We're keeping an eye on it. We're in touch with weather forecasters and we're following it on the internet.'

Thousands along the coast have been ordered to evacuate their homes. Immediate predictions were for the storm to hit land around North Carolina early Thursday, then sweep north up the East Coast toward Virginia, just west of Washington. Philadelphia, 250

For Real Madrid coach Carlos Queiroz it was a satisfying night's work at the Bernabeu.

'Marseille posed us problems for the first 25 minutes but we came back into the match not because they were scared but because we played good football.

"Our game was functioning well. Marseille came not only with three strikers but with a well organised defence and we adapted well - I'm happy with how my team per-
