Most of Barguna govt rural clinics inoperative

BSS, Barguna Most of the 78 community clinics in five upazilas of Barguna district, set up during Awami League rule, are under lock and key.

Local people said the government last year opened 27 of the clinics, but these are not functioning properly due to lack of doctors and medicines. These are manned by only one health assistant or a family welfare assistant. The rest are closed due to lack of health officials.

Each of the clinics was constructed on a 5-decimal plot at a cost of Tk 2.5 lakh. But the rural people are no getting any service since their establishment



Pir followers, rivals clash in Ctg : 10 hurt

At least ten people were injured when two rival Islamic organisations clashed at a rally on the premises of Jhautala railway station here on Friday.

Anjumane Al Biyeeniat, an Islamic organisation formed with followers of Pir Razarbagi Syed Mommad Dillur Rahman, organised the rally to protest allegedly derogatory comments about their Peer, witnesses said.

A rival group styled Jagroto Touhidi Janata comprising leaders and activities of several Islamic political organisations attacked the rally, they said.

The attackers ransacked the pandal and snatched the mikes of the rally.

Chase and counter-chase took place when the activists of Tauhidi Janata attacked their rivals with lethal weapons and brick-bats, they added.

Later, police brought the situation under control.
