## Mass transit-- a solution to urban cholesterol

N Dhaka city, parks, streets and open spaces work as breathing space, where fresh air with less pollutant is supposed to be advantageous to our health. But these spaces fail to serve our purpose as the air pockets trap the pollutions mainly from car exhaustion. Another point is the security, which sounds feasible in case of mono-rail having a full chance of observation by security personnel. These matters need careful and thorough estimation and feasibility study

Bottomline: The bottomline is that we need a city which would work harmoniously with the movement of people. This would bring an efficient system of infrastructure which every urban dwellers dream of. A better and efficient transportation system is not a luxury but an essential element of a city. We hope to work together by bringing all expertise existing in our country with an honest approach to a successful city; and it is not that far when our next generation would enjoy a sustainable and healthy city. Financial feasibility: According to our honourable minister of finance (quoted: 'Money is no problem!'), we see a clear horizon of assurance from the government. So, dear readers, our dear holy Prophet Hazrat Muhammad (pbuh was carried in body from the Sacred Mosque in (Mecca) to the Farthest Mosque (Baitul Muqaddis in Jerusalem) on a horse called "Al-Buraq" in the company of archangel Hazrat Jibrail (A) on 27th of the holy lunar month of Rajab. On reaching the Farthest Mosque he tethered his horse to a ring in the gate of mosque and entered into the mosque and while in this mosque (in Jerusalem) other Prophets (peace be upon them) offered prayer under the leadership of the holy Prophet Muhammad (SM). After the prayer angel Jibrail (A) took the Messenger of Allah (pbuh) to all the seven heavens one after another. After leaving the precints of the Masjidul-Aqsa (Jerusalem) when Jibrail (A) took the holy Prophet (pbuh) to the first heaven on the same vehicle ("Al-Buraq") he asked the guardian angel to open the gate, and as soon as the gate was opened Hazrat Adam (A), the Progenitor of mankind appeared. After witnessing Sidrat-ul-Muntaha and "Al-Bait-al Mamur" the Messenger of Allah was taken to the Divine Presence by a special vehicle called "Raf Raf" after passing through seventy thousand veils of Almighty Allah's Light ('Noor') and here he 'experienced the thrill of witnessing the Divine Glory and Manifestation at the closest possible propinquity," according to an observation made by Safi-ur-Rahman al-Mubarakpuri (Islamic University Al-Madina Al-Munwara) in his world famous book "entitled Ar-Raheeq Al-Makhtum" (The Sealed Nectar). And while in the Divine Presence what Merciful Allah gave our holy Prophet (pbuh) as a gift to His dear Friend? It was "Salat" that is, five-time daily prayer for him and all his adult eligible followers. But as regards this five-time daily obligatory prayers it has a background which I would like to inform my dear readers about. It may be mentioned here that at first Rabbul Alameen, Lord Creator, ordained 50 times daily prayer for the Messenger of Allah (pbuh) and all his followers and on his return when he spoke to Hazrat Musa (A) and informed him that his Creator enjoined 50 times of daily prayers for him and his followers. On hearing this Hazrat Musa (A) expressed his apprehension and said that the followers of the holy Prophet (pbuh) would not be able to offer prayers for he requested him to go back to Almighty Allah for reduction of the

Lord Creator and said: "I feel ashamed of repeatedly asking my Lord for reduction, I accept and resign to His Will". Then the holy Prophet (pbuh) returned to this mundane world with the Gift of "Salat", that is, five times daily prayers for him and his followers.

"Salat" or five-time daily prayer is one of the 5 strong Pillars of the grand edifice of Islam. The Holy Quran says in clear and unambiguous terms: "Establish regular prayer, for prayer restrains from shameful and evil deeds; and Remembrance of Allah is the greatest thing in life." But unfortunately Muslims are oblivious of this duty which is obligatory on the part of every eligible Muslim One may ask whether the Messen-

ger of Allah (peace by upon him) saw his creator with his physical eye or not. Some interpreters are of opinion that seeing Allah Rabbul Alameen with naked eyes has not been confirmed. But Ibne Abbas has said "the word 'Ru Ya' as used in the Noble Ouran signifies the observation with the help of the eye" (5-38) as clearly indicated in the aforesaid book entitled "Ar-Raheeq Al-Makhtum" (the sealed Nectar P.149).

As regards the holy Prophet's

miraculous Ascension through the seven Spheres of Heavens there was nothing unusual for the true Muslims. They thought if Almighty Allah is powerful enough to have created the heavens and the earth by an act of His Will (cf. Ayat 58 of Sura Ya Sin of the Holy Ouran) then He is surely Powerful enough to take His Friend the holy Prophet (pbuh) beyond the heavens and show some of His wonderful signs at first hand which are inaccessible to man otherwise. The disbelievers, however, went to Hazrat Abu Baqar Siddiqi because of this unusual event and he readily said: "Yes, I do verify it." And it was on this occasion the great companion of the Messenger of Allah (pbuh) earned the title as "Siddig" meaning verifier of the

It may be recalled here that when years before two American astronauts landed on the surface of the moon the people of the whole world were dumbfounded to hear this sensational news. The astronauts, while spacing on the surface of the moon, spoke to their President sitting in the White House over telephone and exchanged greetings with him And before the two spacemen were fully prepared for their flight in the outerspace with their spaceships thorough medical check-up and years of exercise and training were essential and the persons responsible for imparting such long and arduous training were the world renowned NASA scientists. But was it at all necessary for our dear holy Prophet for any medical checkup or for receiving any exercise? It was not; for the Almighty Allah was Powerful enough to take him to His Divine Presence. HE weak submits to the strong. Might is an advantage, in the natural order of things. Generally, it gets its way. The conquest is often carried to extremity, where righteousness is treated with ugly arrogance. It is therefore not without foundation that human spirit in its abject submission bemoans, might is right. However might in its extremity is self destructive, so might is always not right. In its extremity might is a state of perpetual combat, an unwholesome obsession with self-protection that sees threat everywhere. Peace, the foremost precondition for might to translate it into lasting reward finds it an inhospitable place. Unless tempered by accommodation, recourse to might becomes a dispiriting cycle. Turbulence that marks the recourse to might banishes peace. In today's world we countenance many examples of the folly of building peace with might. Israeli prime minister Ariel Sharon's brutalities against the Palestinians are a poignant example of this folly.

Palestinian problem and the dilemma of Iraq are the trouble spots where might is stumbling in building peace. Both the places are witnessing the exertion and the desperation of the mightiest country of the world. Israel by virtue of its patronage by United  $States\,represents\,a\,force\,to\,reckon\,with$ in the Middle East. America's much publicised 'Road Map' for peace in the region has been immobilised by remorseless use of force by Ariel Sharon's stubbornly hostile policies. His deep-seated disdain for the Palestinians offers little hope for accommodation. He considers might an important tool in cowing down the Palestinians to accept peace on his terms. The brutal reprisals he conducts with vengeance shows us a mind driven by might. Sharon is ill equipped for peace. It makes him a troublesome partner for

The occupation of Beirut and the formation of a Christian enclave in the southern Lebanon were spearheaded by Ariel Sharon. It succeeded in driving out the PLO from Beirut, but wresting the domination of Lebanon from Hizbullah, Amal and the Druzes could never be achieved. The world still remembers his complicity in Christian militia rampage of Chabra and Shatila camps that killed 750 Palestinians. Israel maintained a military presence in southern Lebanon for a long time. Sharon's vaunted might could not end militant resistance. Instead Israeli casualties kept rising. It resulted in Israel's meek withdrawal from southern Lebanon. There are other fields too where

Sharon's obsession with force has placed Israel in a situation with little room to manoeuvre. Oslo accord has defaulted badly on time frame to render it ineffective. Even Israeli Arabs have been driven to desperation and

Sharon's might has done to peace. The peace he wants for Israel is for the Palestinians to submit to an order built on the might of Israel. He has jeopardised the prospect of peace built by the boldness of Sadat, the sincerity of Rabin and the moderation of Arafat.

There never was a time when hopes of a peace have been dashed with such arrogance. Americans have their hands full in Iraq. The Presidential election is just a year away. Peace may have to wait for another person, another day. Presently, gloom is descending on Palestine. Is there no way of looking at Palestine dispassionately? Yes, there is a lot to grieve over the Palestinians. They have been driven out of their land, dispossessed of their country for no fault of theirs. Someone else's crime became their bane. It is a painful fact that arms cannot bring back their land. A place in the Middle East recognised by international community and accepted by Israel can restore Palestinians to honour and eminence.
