Local people caught Hasan and handed over him to police. A case was filed with Bayezid police.

According to the Flood Forecasting and Warning Centre (FFWC), the overall flood situation in the affected districts of Chapainawabganj Rajshahi, Pabna, Rajbari, Manikganj Munshiganj, Madaripur and Magura are improving with the recession of water levels in the rivers of Brahmaputra-Jamuna, Gangaes-Padma and the Mohananda.

All these rivers recorded fall at most of the points in last 24 hours and are likely to fall further.
