But the knockout blow came in the 67th minute when Arif scored his second to seal Bangladesh's fate in

the 7th-8th classification match. The defeat completed a miserable chapter in Bangladesh hockey. Before leaving for the Malaysian capital, the team declared that they were going to beat China and secure the all-important sixth place for an entry into the World Cup

qualifiers. But at the end they were dumped in the South China Sea after giving away 35 goals.

India, Pakistan revive cricket at jr level

Indian and Pakistani youngsters are set to revive cricketing ties between the two nations when the Asian emerging teams tournament oneday international series gets underway here. Indian captain Gautham Ghabir

said: "We look forward to the tournament and it's nice to play Pakistan in Sri Lanka. It will be a great opportu-

His Pakistani rival Qaiser Abbas said: "We have a very good young side. We hope we can go on to win." India and Pakistan play each

other in the first round game at the Premadasa Stadium in Colombo Sunday

India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka play each other twice before the final on October 5.

The Secretary of Sri Lanka Cricket Mohan De Silva said the tournament was part of an initiative of the Asian Cricket Council, which had provided almost 75 per cent of the funding.

De Silva said eligibility for the tournament was limited to those players who had played no more than two Tests and five one-day internationals.

The hosts play India in the curtain-raiser on Saturday

"Essentially our position has not changed," a spokesman for the Department of Culture, Media and Sport told the Guardian.

"Ministers made it clear before the World Cup that they did not want an England cricket team to play in Zimbabwe and nothing has changed on the ground to alter that view.

"The tour is still a long way away but if things remain the same in Zimbabwe we would suggest that the team does not tour.' MacLaurin does not want the

But Vince Hogg, managing director of the Zimbabwe Cricket Union, says the tour will go ahead. He told the BBC website: "I

believe England will fulfil the fixtures. I've had no indications that they won't."

England, citing security concerns, refused to play in Zimbabwe during the World Cup, forfeiting points which ultimately led to their failure to progress beyond the first round.
