

Dalmiya demands WC cash

Indian cricket board president Jagmohan Dalmiya on Sunday set a November 1 deadline for the International Cricket Council (ICC) to release India's share of World Cup money before it takes legal action

"We will resort to arbitration and appoint appropriate agencies to investigate the claims if the money is not released by that date, Dalmiya said shortly after winning his third term at the helm.

The ICC withheld India's share of the proceeds due to damage claims

from its financial agencies, the Global Cricket Corporation (GCC) and World Sport Nimbus, who said they suffered financial losses from a contracts row involving Indian players

Dalmiya said that since at least two main sponsors. Pepsi and Hero-Honda, were not interested in any claims, there was no reason to hold back the 6.5 million dollars due to the Indian board.

"The sponsors are not rigid and the GCC's claims of loss of revenue from TV advertisements, too, is not convincing as there was a record booking of advertisements during this year's World Cup," he said. Dalmiya criticised the ICC's
