Raul, Helguera boost Real

Real Madrid captain Raul has come through a fitness test on a niggling hip injury and will line up against Porto in

the Champions League. Real, who opened their European campaign with a 4-2 win over French side Olympique Marseille, will be without England captain David Beckham, nursing a foot injury after hurting his right foot when taking a





The Africans, ranked ninth in the International Cricket Council's Test Championship, will face the world's top-ranked team on a bouncy Perth wicket. The WACA Ground pitch is

famous for forcing touring batsmen to duck and weave against the Australia pace attack led by Jason Gillespie, Brett Lee and Glenn McGrath. "Perth is a bouncy wicket. It's

unique in world cricket and there is always a chance somebody is going to get hurt over there," Waugh was quoted as saying in Sydney's The Daily Telegraph newspaper on

Waugh is the game's mostcapped player and second-leading run-scorer with 10,521 runs at 51.07 from 162 matches including 32 centuries

The 38-year-old has hit centuries at all Australia's current Test venues except for Perth. Waugh's highest score in his 14 Tests at the WACA Ground is 99 not out in the fifth Test against England in 1994-95.

The first Test against Zimbabwe starts in Perth on October 9. The second and final Test starts in Sydney on October 17.

Australia will name their team for the first Test on Wednesday.


