Bangladesh Non-Government Primary Teachers' Association (BNPTA) yesterday announced an action programme to realise the demand for nationalisation of their


According to the programme, a memorandum will be submitted to the prime minister on December 30 urging her to meet their one-point

Congress on cerebral palsy begins



"In a 10-year data of the Shishu Bikash Clinic of the Bangladesh Protibondhi Foundation, 70 per cent disabled children were diagnosed to have cerebral palsy," she said.

The Network Chairperson Prof. Naila Z Khan said that her organisation is working for the children who are usually considered disabled. "Extensive study has shown that

most of the children brought to the service centre for treatment have been suffering from disabilities due to cerebral palsy," she said. "Let's measure the ability of the

children and not their disability," said Prof. M. A Mannan, president of Bangladesh Paediatric Association. 'Every seven children per 1000

n Bangladesh have either physical

or mental or both kinds of retarda-Majority of the disabled children has no access to health services and the health professionals often fail to provide useful diagnosis, advice and counselling for the
