BFUJ, DUJ submit memo to PM

The journalists' unions submitted a memorandum to the prime minister vesterday to press for their various demands, including immediate formation of the sixth wage board for the newspapermen.

The other demands include formulation of a national policy for newspaper industry, 60 percent dearness allowance, reinstatement of journalists of Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha and reopening of ETV.

Before submitting the memorandum, the Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists (BFUJ) and the Dhaka Union of Journalists (DUJ) held a rally in front of the Jatiya Press Club. BFUJ President Iqbal Sobhan Chowdhury, Secretary General Akhter Ahmed Khan, DUJ President Abdul Jalil Bhuivan and General Secretary Omar Faruk spoke at the rally

After the rally, the journalists marched towards the PM's Office in a procession to submit the memorandum, but police intercepted them twice -- in front of the Engineers Institute and near the Shishu Park.

Later, five union leaders went to the PM's Office and handed over the memorandum to PM's Political Secretary Harris Chowdhury.


Power supply was restored in Chittagong city after mending the transformer at Khulshi Grid Substation at around 5.30pm yesterday

It took nearly 24 hours to mend the technical faults at the substation.

Due to unprecedented power outage, about 40 per cent of the entire city plunged into darkness at around 6.20pm on Tuesday.

to the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association Conference visited the immigration section of the British High Commission in Dhaka earlier this week, says a press release.

During the visit, parliamentarians Harry Cohen and Brian Jenkins saw the improvement the British High Commission has introduced over the past year to its visa issuing section.

Lawson Ross, head of the immigration section, explained to them that the number of Bangladeshi applicants for British visas has risen by 28 percent compared to the previous year, with 68 percent rise in student visa alone.

Despite the increasing number of applicants, the streamlined service at the immigration section has helped the British High Commission maintain its target, he said.

The MPs were also shown the new service for students. introduced earlier this year in association with the British Council. The E.DoCs service speeds up the processing for their UK visa applications.

The MPs also saw the Visa Express facility in action. Under the scheme, frequent travellers to the UK do not have to come to the high commission in person but can submit their applications through a courier or representative.

The British High Commission website (http://w-ww.ukinbangladesh.org) contains further details on criteria that must be fulfilled to benefit from the Visa Express facility. Under normal circumstances, this facility also provides for a same day service.
