As he left the field, Hayden was mobbed by teammates, with Justin Langer, his opening partner, having special congratulations for his close friend Hayden and Langer have

become the most successful opening partnership in Australian Test history. At the start of the new season,

they averaged 68.13 runs per stand from 24 matches together, including nine hundred-plus stands and seven more partnerships between 50 and 99.

There was only one major blemish in the Hayden innings -when on 337 he gave a chance to Gripper, at long-off, off Sean Ervine, but the catch went begging. Gripper gained small consola-

tion by finally dismissing Hayden after tea when he swept a delivery backward of square leg and was caught by Stuart Carlisle.

The carnage followed Zimbabwe captain Heath Streak's decision to send Australia into bat after he won the toss.

Hayden, who had laboured for 308 minutes to reach 100 -- his 15th Test century -- smashed the next 100 in 104 minutes the third 100 in 117 minutes and his final 80 runs in 93 minutes

The 77-Test veteran reached the milestone on the third day of the first Test against New Zealand here when he forced Jacob Oram to edge a catch to his Karnataka teammate Rahul Dravid in the slips

Kumble, 32, hit the headlines in 1999 when he scalped all 10 wickets in an innings during a Test match against arch-rivals Pakistan in New Delhi, a feat achieved only once before by Jim Laker of England.

Kumble, who also has 308 oneday wickets, is only the fourth bowler after Pakistanis Wasim Akram and Waqar Younis and Muttiah Muralitharan of Sri Lanka to take more than 300 wickets in both forms of the game. Kumble is India's second-most

successful Test bowler behind Kapil, who retired in 1994 with a then world record tally of 434 wickets

Fast bowler Courtney Walsh is the current record-holder with 519 wickets

the highest individual score in the history of Test cricket on Friday.

In an awesome display of hitting, the opener reached 380 to overhaul Brian Lara's previous record of 375 as Australia declared on 735 for six just after tea on the second day of the first test against Zimbabwe.

All the players wore armbands in memory of the 202 people, including 88 Australians, killed in the Bali bombings on October 12 last year.

"Those two things, the black armbands and the baggy green just kept me going today," said Hayden,

Hayden raced past it with barely a thought

"Övertaking Bradman sits uncomfortably, and so it should, but was never haunted by the record as I'm sure he would have had an enormous amount of respect for anyone who reached it," he said.

"And we all wear the same baggy green."

Hayden donned his battered head gear in place of his protective helmet in the latter stages of his near two-day innings and said it was hard to express what it meant to him.

The England team could not go to the Bangladesh Krira Shikkha Protisthan (BKSP) yesterday morning for training as planned as their police escort arrived late.


The policemen were supposed to be at the team's hotel by 9 am. But they eventually came at 10:45 am.
