	STAFF CORRESPONDENT  Two alleged members of the outlawed Purbo Banglar Communist Party (PBCP) were arrested with ammunition from city's north Shyamoli under Mohammadpur Police Station in the early hours of yesterday.  The arrested are Raju, 25, and his wife Maksuda, 19, who confessed to being members of the PBCP's Jonojoddha (combatant) wing, police said.  The couple was arrested from their fourth-floor residence at 201/1, West Agargaon when police raided the house following a tip-off that a top PBCP leader Tapan Mahmud alias Dada Tapan was hiding there.  Police recovered 21 rounds of Chinese rifle bullets from their possession and also confiscated PBCP literature including posters, leaflets and books found elsewhere in the house.  According to the couple's confessional statement, top PBCP leaders frequented the house from where Dada Tapan coordinated activities of the outlawed organisation.  A sedition case and another case under the arms act were filed against the arrested.  The couple was produced before the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court, Dhaka yesterday with a petition for a seven-day remand.
